Old Canvas and gave him, Sam Oil. Latter part
fresh breezes from S.E. with fog squalls.

Remarks Wednesday Aug 28th
Begins with strong breezes from S.E. under
Double reef. Latter part strong winds. Saw two
Whalers.

Lat 33-29 Long 76-31

Remarks Thursday Aug 29th
Begins with strong winds from S.E. under Double
reef. Saw the Matilda & Stamboul jamming.
Latter part fresh breezes.

Lat 33-34 Long 76-09

Remarks Friday Aug 30th
Begins with fresh breezes from S.E. One sail
in sight. Latter part moderate breezes from N.W.
steering S.E.

Lat 33-57 Long 76-26

Remarks Saturday Aug 31st.
Begins with moderate breezes from N.W. Course
S.E. at sundown shortened sail and heaved too
head to the N.W. Latter part fresh breezes from N.W.

Lat 34-52 Long 75-56

Remarks Sunday Sept 1st 1878.
Begins with breezes from N.W. Spoke the Matilda.
Latter part the same. The Matilda and Stamboul in
sight.

Lat 35-03 Long 75-51

Remarks Monday Sept 2nd.
Begins with fresh breezes from N.W. Caught
a Veright whale porpoise. Latter part moderate
and foggy.

Lat 35-09 Long 76-12

Remarks Tuesday Sept 3rd.
Begins with light breezes from W and foggy.
Latter part fresh breezes and thick
weather.

Lat 35-22 Long 76-21

Dark Mary & Susan Cruising off Maulie.

Remarks Wednesday Sept 4th 1878.
Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. and squally.
Latter part strong winds from the S. steering S.E. Saw
four Whalers. One of them sailing.

Lat 35-47 Long 75-16

Remarks Thursday Sept 5th
Begins with strong winds from the S and squally.
Under Double reef. Latter part strong winds. Saw two
Whalers.

Lat 35-31 Long 75-24

Remarks Friday Sept 6th.
Begins with strong breezes from S.E. under Double
reef. Saw Blackbird and fin. Whalers. Latter part strong
winds from S.E. under two close reef.

Lat 35-29 Long 75-18

Remarks Saturday Sept 7th
Begins with strong breezes from S.E. under close
reef and fore sail. Latter part fresh
breezes from the S. at 9 A.M. raised a dead whale
labeled a boat. at 10 took him along side. at 11
hooked on. And it was the fattest cutting that
I ever saw.

Lat 35-34 Long 74-57

Remarks Sunday Sept 8th
Begins with moderate breezes from the S.
Employed cutting the stinker. at 2 1/2 finished
labeled it on Deck. Cut it up and put it into
the tank. Saw four ships jamming. at 7
P.M. started the works. Latter part light
breezes from N.W. saw two Whalers. Bump. Whalers
Porpoises and four sail. at 11 finished sailing. turned
up 26 bbls of rather dark oil.
