Remarks Saturday Feb 15th 1879

First part a Gale of wind from S.E. Hove too
head to the S.W. under close reefed Main Top Sail and
Stag Sails. The Sea very rough. The whale alongside
under our lee with a 11 inch blowser.
On him. He makes awful tearing work. I hope we shall
save him. He is a very large whale. But we do not know.
I hope the Lord will bless us with weather tomorrow
with weather to cut. Latter part more moderate. at 6 P.
He hooked on and began to cut. He made awful work
of it. but we got a long better than I expected. no more
cutting. Lat 41-53

Remarks Sunday Feb 16th

First part Strong winds from S.E. Employed cutting.
got the head off and the body in at 7 P.M.
Latter part Moderate but a rough Sea. at noon
had the head in and cleared away.

Remarks Monday Feb 17th

Winds S.W. moderate. Employed cutting junk.
at 2 P.M. commenced Bailing. Latter part
Moderate Breezes from S.E. Lat 41-32 Long 76-28

Remarks Tuesday Feb 18th

First part Moderate Breezes from S.E. Employed
Bailing Latter part Moderate Breezes from
S. E. Lat 41-24 Long 76-43

Remarks Wednesday Feb 19th

First part Moderate Breezes from S.W. Employed
Bailing. Latter part Strong winds from S.W.
and rugged. Employed Staving down the whale
turned up 118 Bbls. Lat 41-34 Long 76-16

Remarks Thursday Feb 20th

First part Strong winds from S.W. and
rugged. Employed Staving Oil. Latter part
rugged. at 10 P.M. finished Staving down the Oil.
Staved 111 Bbls. Lat 42-00 Long 76-15

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Remarks Friday Feb 21st 1879

First part Strong winds from Westward and
rugged. Employed repairing the Lar Boat.
Latter part Squally. at work on the Boat.
Lat 42-30 Long 76-10

Remarks Saturday Feb 22nd

First part Moderate Breezes from S.W. to S.E. and
a heavy S.W. swell. repairing the Boat. Latter part Calm.
finished the Boat and put her on the Cranes.
No Cal

Remarks Sunday Feb 23rd

First part Calm. at 7 P.M. took a Breeze from S.W.
Latter part Moderate Breezes from the N. Steering
E. Lat 42-39 Long 76-12

Remarks Monday Feb 24th

First part Moderate Breezes from N. at 2 P.M. began
to rain. And the wind hauled to the S. wore ship
to the Westward. Chile in sight 30 miles.
Latter part Strong winds from S.E. by S.
Lat 42-43 Long 76-43

Remarks Tuesday Feb 25th

First part fresh Breezes from S. Latter part wind
S. and increasing. Lat 42-20 Long 76-40

Remarks Wednesday Feb 26th

First part Wind S. and increasing. prospect of a
Gale. Bar 29.5/100. Middle part Gale. Latter more moderate
but rugged. fitted the windlass. Bitt. Lat 42-68 Long 76-36

Remarks Thursday Feb 27th

First part Strong winds from W.S.W. and a heavy S.W. swell.
Latter part Strong winds from W.S.W. and rugged.
Lat 42-44 Long 76-56

Remarks Friday Feb 28th

First part Strong winds from W.S.W. to S.W. and
rugged. Latter part Strong winds from S. and
increasing. Spoke the Stamboul. with
nothing since we saw her last.
