Close reef. Fibb and Shanker. Latter part the same.
Chiloe in sight - Dist 25 miles. Lat 42-31 Long 74-53

Remarks Tuesday March 18th
First part - Strong winds from the S.E. under South
reef. Latter part - Moderate breezes
Lat 42-15 Long 76-02

Remarks Wednesday March 19th
First part - Moderate breezes from S.
Latter part - Strong winds from S.E. by S.
Lat 42-27 Long 75-53

Remarks Thursday March 20th
First part - Strong winds from S.E. by S. Killed
the old saw. This is Anna's birth day.
20 years old. the twentieth and 20 years old
that will never be again for her. Latter part light air.
Repaired the Fibb. Lat 42-20 Long 75-37

Remarks Friday March 21st
First part - light air from S.E. Latter part fresh
breezes from S.E. Lat 42-14 Long 75-14

Remarks Saturday March 22nd
First part - fresh breezes from S.E. by E.
Saw Blackfish. Latter part - Moderate.
Lat 42-23 Long 74-58

Remarks Sunday March 23rd
First part - Moderate breezes from S. at 6
P.M. Shortened sail. and started off N.N.W.
Chiloe in sight - Dist 25 miles. Latter part
wind to the N.W. started for the N. and the wind
came out ahead. So not to be out long. Made
a fair sail of it and sailed to the Southward.
all day. Land in sight. Lat 42-36 Long 75-15

Remarks Monday March 24th 1879
First part - Strong winds from the N. Course S by W.
at 3 P.M. double reef. at 6 Close reef and luff. a 100
to the Westward. Latter part - Strong winds from N.W.
to S.W. and rainy. with a heavy swell. no Ch.

Remarks Tuesday March 25th
First part - Strong winds from W. and W. and rugged.
Latter part - fresh breezes from S.W. and squally. Starting
in for Haupo. at 11 raised it bearing E by N Dist 35 miles.
Lat 43-35 Long 75-18

Remarks Wednesday March 26th
First part - Strong winds from S.W. and very rugged.
at 3 P.M. Haupo bearing E N.E. by Cam. as Dist 15 miles
put the Bark off N.W. for the St. Mary's ground.
Latter part - light air from the S. Course N.W.
Chiloe in sight. Lat 42-25 Long 75-15

Remarks Thursday March 27th
First part - light air from the S. Course N.W.
Chiloe in sight. Latter part - Wind from N.N.E. at
noon Chiloe put in sight. Dist 60 miles. Very Clear.
Lat 41-27 Long 75-24

Remarks Friday March 28th
First part - Moderate breezes from N. to N.E.
Middle part - Moderate from Eastward. and slowly
hauling East about. the wind very seldom goes so.
Latter part - fresh from S.E. Lat 40-14 Long 75-48

Remarks Saturday March 29th
First part - fresh breezes from the S.E. Course N.
Latter part - pleasant breezes from S.E. Saw a skil.
Lat 38-03 Long 75-08

Remarks Sunday March 30th
First part - pleasant breezes from S.E. by E
Course N.E. by N. Saw hump backs and a whale.
at 8 P.M. Shortened sail. Latter part - moderate
breezes from S. and fine. at noon the high
Land of St. Mary's in sight - Dist 30 miles.
