heading by to the Eastward. under  
double reef. Latter part strong winds  
and thick weather. Lat 24=51 Long 137=09

Remarks Friday Oct 3<sup>rd</sup>  
First part fresh breezes from N. E. to N. by  
N. heading by to the Eastward.  
Latter part fresh winds from N. E. heading  
from E. to E. S. E. under top sails.  
Lat 25=29 Long 135=18

Remarks Sat Oct 4<sup>th</sup>.  
First part strong winds from N. E. heading  
by to the Eastward. and whole top sails.  
Latter part the same kind of winds  
and weather. Lat 26=08 Long 133=25

Remarks Sunday Oct 5<sup>th</sup>.  
First part fresh breezes and squalls  
from N. E. heading by to the Eastward.  
Latter part moderate from N. E. at noon  
tacked ship to the N. W. Lat 36=44 Long 132=36

Remarks Monday Oct 6<sup>th</sup>  
First part moderate from N. E. heading by  
to the N. W. latter part the same kind  
of winds. at noon tacked Eastward.  
Lat 25=16 Long 133=14

Remarks Tuesday Oct 7<sup>th</sup>.  
First part fresh breezes from N. E. heading  
by to the Eastward. Latter part light  
breezes from N. by E.  
Lat 25=34 Long 131=30

Remarks Wednesday Oct 8<sup>th</sup> 1879  
First part light breezes from the North heading  
by to the Eastward. Latter part fresh breezes from  
N. by E. to N. N. W. at 5 P. M. raised Pitcairn fearing  
N. N. E. Dist 40 miles. a dead beat.  
Lat 25=29 Long 130=11

Remarks Thursday Oct 9<sup>th</sup>  
First part moderate breezes and baffling from  
N. by W. to N. W. heading by to the Eastward. at 6  
P. M. bearing N. Dist 12 miles. Ship heading  
W. Latter part wind to N. W. at 9 P. M. went on  
shore at Pitcairn. ordered 60 lbs sweet potatoes  
2000 oranges. the people of the island set to work  
digging potatoes and getting the other recruits  
together. the 11<sup>th</sup> before the could get the thing  
down it came on bad weather. and I was  
on shore until the 21<sup>st</sup> at 8 o'clock Tuesday  
the 21<sup>st</sup> we sailed away from the island  
for Chile.

Remarks Wednesday the 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Latter part fine weather. at noon  
Pitcairn in sight bearing N by E Dist  
35 miles. Lat 25=44 Long 130=32

Remarks Thursday Oct 23<sup>rd</sup>.  
First part wind E by S and fine. head  
to the S. Latter part fresh breezes with squalls  
S W swell. Lat 26=34 Long 130=59

Remarks Friday Oct 24<sup>th</sup>.  
First part strong winds from E & S and squalls  
heading by to the South under top sails.  
Latter part wind E and rain. No Obs.

Remarks Saturday Oct 25<sup>th</sup>  
First part wind E by N and slowly hauling  
to the Northward. rain and rough. at  
4 P. M. wind N by N. Course E by E.  
Latter part moderate from E.  
Lat 27=24 Long 131=01
