squalls heading by to the S. at 2 P.M. Double reefed.
Latter part fresh breezes with fog squalls. at 6-20 A.
On raised a school of small whales. at 7^{1/2} hauled
the boats struck four. last one by drawing in the snarl.
at 12 On got them along side. with the boat boat
stave quite bad. Lat 40-21 Long 79-44

Remarks Sunday Nov 30th
Begins with strong winds from W.S.W. with
fog squalls. at 2 P.M. commenced cutting.
at 4 finished one. hooked on to the other.
part the fluke chain took an hour to
get him. fast again. at 6^{1/2} finished him.
put an extra chain on the other and gave
up. cutting for the night. Middle and latter
part very rough. at 6 A.M. commenced cutting
the other whale. at 9 finished.

S.W. and thick weather at 1 P.M. finished bailing.

First part fresh breezes from W.S.W. course
S.W. under double reefs. Latter part a gale from
S.W. and rainy finished stowing down the oil. Stowed
bbls. Lat 42-22 Long 81-57

Begins with a gale from the N. Cairn S.
raining hard. at 2 P.M. cleared off once
moderated a little and hauled to W.S.W. took
Hare Clap sail. at 5 Close reef and set it
again course S. barometer low. 29^{3/10}. Latter part
wind S.W. by W. set double reefs at 11^{1/2} Close reef
again. Bar 29^{25/100}. at noon 29^{3/10}

Lat 43-12 Long 81-32
Remarks Friday Dec 5th
Begins with strong gales from S.W. by W. heading
by to the southward under close reefs and stay
sails. Bar at 6 P.M. 29^{4/10}. Latter part a little
more moderate. still squally. Bar 29^{6/10}.

Lat 44-02 Long 81-18
Remarks Saturday Dec 6th
Begins with strong winds from W.S.W. to
W.S.W. a heavy sea. under close reefs and
stay sails. Latter part moderate from the East.
Bar 29^{5/10} repaired the B boat.

Remarks Sunday Dec 7th
First part light air from E to S. at
5 P.M. gave up the weight weighing. and
shaped the course for Hesperia.
Latter part moderate from S.W. to W.S.W.
