Remarks Saturday Jan 10th 1881
Began with fresh breezes from W & W and
squally. Chile in sight. Latter part fresh
breezes from S.W. Latter part -
Lat 43-23 Long 75-56

Remarks Sunday Jan 11th
First part fresh breezes from S.W. and
squally. Spoke the Comets. Teller. Reutiter
and 8 Daunting & Dillaw. Latter part moderate
and fog squally. 7 sails in sight.
Lat 43-19 Long

Remarks Monday Jan 12th
Began with moderate breezes with fresh
squalls of fog. Spoke the Daunting & Dillaw.
Daught & Daubber took 208 for it.
got two Cooper Hammer paid 6¢ for them.
Huaco bearing E by N. 10 miles.
Latter part a gale from S.W. by W. under close reef.
Huaco dist 28 miles.
Lat 43-13 Long 75-59

Remarks Tuesday Jan 13th
Began with high winds from S.W. under
close reef. Latter part more moderate
from S.W. but slowly hauling to the westward
and breezing on. A cable fell from one of our
rigs and killed him. No obs

Remarks Wednesday Jan 14th
First part strong winds from W & W
and increasing to a gale. At 2 1/2 PM
close reefed the fore sails and furlled the
fore sail. At 5 took in the fore
top sail. Thick and raining. Killed a
hog. The bark Stamboul under our
red 4 miles dist. Bar 29.90. Latter
part strong winds from S.W. by W and
rugged. At 8 A.M. Capt. Rogers of the Stamboul
sent Callers of distress. I went on board of
him and found a man had just fallen

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from the fore top gallant cross tree to the deck.
His name was John C. Godfrey of Fairhaven.
Said from in this ship. and deserted at Valca.
He was insensible when I went on board at
6 1/2 PM when I returned to my own ship. He
was the same. There appeared to be no bones
broken. Wound on one side just above the hip.
There was a slight bruise. On one side (just)
of the head above the temple was an abrasure
of the scalp where a glancing blow had been
received in his fall. What appeared the most
serious wound. The skull was not fractured
that we could perceive. It appears more
like a concussion of the brain than any other
wound that I could perceive.

Remarks Thursday Jan 15th
First part a moderate gale from S.W. by W
under close reef. I was on board the
Stamboul until 6 1/2 PM. very rough.
Bar 29.50. Latter part the same kind of
wind and weather. No obs

Remarks Friday Jan 16th
Began with a gale from S.W. under
close reef. The Stamboul in company.
at 5 1/2 PM wore ship to the W. & W. at
6 the Stamboul wore to the westward
and came to the wind with the main top sail
back. Let her Callers half mast. I suppose
that John Godfrey the man that fell from ship
is dead and they were burying him. Poor
man. His mother. At 6 1/2 took in
fore top sail. Bar 29.90 and falling.
Latter part wind from S.W. to S and rising.
No obs

First part strong winds from S.W.
and raining under close reef. Latter part
more moderate wind S.W. by S. Lat 42-19 Long 76-43
