Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. Course S.  
Latter part moderate breezes from S. Course  
S.E. by S. Lat 39-28 Long 75-49

Remarks Friday Jan 30<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with light air from S to W.  
Course S. Latter part moderate breezes  
from S.W. Course S.E. at 8 P.M. made  
the Island of Macha. Saw 83<sup>rd</sup> Peak.  
Sent down the bare top sail to repair.  
Lat 38-30 Long 74-38

Remarks Saturday Jan 31<sup>st</sup>  
Begins with moderate breezes from  
S.W. Employed repairing the bare top  
sail. Macha Dist 15 miles. Latter  
part moderate breezes from W by W to S.  
Course S by E. Land in sight Dist 25 miles  
Lat 37-28 Long 74-17

Remarks Sunday Feb 1<sup>st</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes from S.E.  
Course S.E. at 1 P.M. hauled off  
shore to the westward. Land Dist 18  
miles. Latter part strong winds from  
S.E. Course W by W under double  
reef main & close reef fore.  
Lat 36-20 Long 76-11

Remarks Monday Feb 2<sup>nd</sup>  
Begins with strong winds from  
S.E. Course S.W. by W under  
close reef. Latter part moderate  
breezes from S.E. to S.W.  
Lat 34-54 Long 77-42

Remarks Tuesday Feb 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Begins with moderate breezes from S.W.  
by W. Course S.W. by W. Latter part  
moderate from W by W.  
Lat 34-14 Long 78-36

Remarks Wednesday Feb 4<sup>th</sup> 1880  
Begins with moderate breezes from  
S.W. Juan in sight bearing S.W. by W 1/2 W.  
Latter part fresh breezes from W by S. Juan  
Dist 25 miles bearing W by S. Employed  
repairing the main top sail.  
Lat 33-37 No Ab

Remarks Thursday Feb 5<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes from W at  
3 1/2 P.M. hauled in a squall to the S.  
finished and bent the top sail.  
Latter part fresh breezes from S.  
at noon Juan Dist 10 miles.  
Lat 33-22 Long 78-44

Remarks Friday Feb 6<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes from  
S. at 7 P.M. Juan bearing S.E. Dist  
12 miles. Latter part moderate from W  
by W. Lat 33-12 Long 79-31

Remarks Saturday Feb 7<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes from  
W by W. Latter part fresh breezes from  
S.W. with fog squalls.  
Lat 33-10 Long 79-00

Remarks Sunday Feb 8<sup>th</sup>  
First part fresh breezes from S.W. with  
fog squalls. at 7 P.M. Juan bearing S.E.  
Dist 12 miles. We have seen a comet  
the past four nights, the first night the  
star was below the horizon, but last  
night it was all visible. The tail looked  
20 or 25 degrees long. I have never seen but  
one as long, that was when we were bound  
from our first voyage in the Abigail, in  
Feb 1843, 37 days ago.  
Latter part moderate from S.W.  
at noon Juan Dist 7 miles  
Lat 33-33 Long 79-06
