Sept. 18th day 18th

This day begins with strong winds from
off on the starboard tack at sundown
the same middle parts moderated at day
light and latter parts pleasant breeze from
from NW steering SW by S one
sail watch employed in the ship's
duties Lat 33.53 N Lon 32.23 W

Wednesday 19th

This day begins with pleasant breeze
from NW steering SW by S one
sail employed in the ship's duties at
sun down on the starboard tack
middle parts light winds from NW
at day light and latter parts two sails
in sight watch employed in the
ship's duties Lat 33.30 N Lon 32.5

Thursday 20th

This day begins with light fair from
NW on the starboard tack two sails
in sight at sundown light air
Continued middle parts the same at day
light and latter parts fine breeze from
SW on the starboard tack one sail
in sight watch employed in Cooper's
oil Lat 33.05 N Lon 33.04 W

Friday 21st

This day begins with pleasant breeze
from NW on the port tack stored
down 30 lbs oil in between decks
at sun down took in sail on the
starboard tack middle parts light air
at day light two sails in sight ship
settled Cheff on latter parts moderate
winds from S on the port tack
watch employed in the ship's duties
Lat 33.10 N Lon

Journal Continued
Sunday September 30th

1874

This day begins with light breeze from S
steering E. N. E. one sail in sight water
employed in the ship's duty at four o'clock
made the Isle of Pico bearing 6 by 6
80 miles off at sun down calm middle
parts breeze up from S E steering E. N. E.
at day light strong breeze island of Fayal
bearing 6 by 6 one sail in sight latter
parts where ship off shore land about 2 1/2 miles
off

Monday October 1st

This day begins with strong breeze from
S E on the port tack thick and raining
weather at sun down strong gale
Continued middle parts moderated at
day light and latter parts thick weather
Saw and spack English Bark fuselire at
noon saw Island of Pico bearing 6 10 miles
ship on the port tack moderate winds from
SW

Tuesday 2nd

This day begins with light winds from
SW wearing to W at 12 PM Calm two
sails in sight Fayal bearing 6 by 6
Pico bearing 6 by 6 distant 12 miles
at sun down calm with heavy swell setting
in shore middle parts strong winds from
off best in shore at day light and
latter parts the same three sails in sight

Wednesday 3rd

This day begins with light and variable winds
at 1 PM Boat went a shore in Fayal
at sun down Boat Return lying off and
on Discharge Anton Oxevid Sick middle
parts strong gale from E run to SW
bare 15 miles at day light strong gale from
E. on the starboard tack latter parts moderate
