Sunday November 5th
This day begins with pleasant breezes
steering S by W watch employed in the
Ship's duty one sail in sight at sun
dawn pleasant breezes continued
middle parts the same at day light
and latter parts the same three sails in
sight Lat 03:10 S Lon 29:10 W

Monday 5th
This day begins with strong breezes
steering S by W at sun dawn strong
breezes continued middle parts strong
breezes at day light two sails in sight
watch employed in Ship's duty stop the
bottom black and found the straps
stranded made mother out of tow line
latter parts Lat 06:14 S Lon 30:10 W

Tuesday 6th
This day begins with pleasant breezes
steering S by W watch employed in
the Ship's duty at sun dawn pleasant
breezes continued middle parts the same
at day light and latter parts pleasant breeze
watch employed in the Ship's duty
Lat 09:06 S Lon

Wednesday 7th
This day begins with strong breezes
steering S by W watch employed in
the Ship's duty at sun dawn the
same continued middle parts the same at
day light and latter parts watch employe
in the Ship's duty Lat 11:31 S
Lon 31:50 W

Sunday December 16th 1844
This day begins with
moderate winds from E steering S by W two
sails in sight at seven p.m. Cape Horn
bearing N by E 35 miles Diego Rocks bearing
N by E 25 light air & calm middle parts light
air from S on the port tack at seven p.m.
moderate winds from S by E on the port
tack at ten o'clock passed within 2 miles
of Diego Rocks latter parts pleasant breeze
from S steering S by W Lat 56:30 S
Lon 40

Monday 17th
This day begins with pleasant breeze from
E by E steering S by W five sails in sight
at seven p.m. wind N by E and rain with
steering S by E with strong breeze at eight
p.m. kept her S by W by W middle parts the same
at one o'clock moderate wind hauled from E
steering N by W at day light and latter parts
the same one sail in sight Lat 54:05 S
Lon 48:25 W

Tuesday 18th
This day begins with moderate winds from N by E
steering N by W and back steering N by W at three p.m.
kept her way W one sail in sight at seven
p.m. light winds middle and latter parts light
winds and calm four sails in sight
Lat 56:52 S Lon 44:29 W

Wednesday 19th
This day begins with moderate winds from
N by W on the starboard tack spack
American Ship Henry Morris of Bath
bound South East at seven p.m. wind
from N by E on the starboard tack
middle parts light and variable winds at day
light and latter parts the same two sails in
sight no lat 5 Lon
