

Journal of Bark Mary & Susan June 1848

Tuesday June 25th

This day begins with strong breezes Bark on the starboard tack and sail in sight at sun down strong breeze continued middle part the same at day light strong breezes at seven A.M. were ship on the port tack one sail in sight watch employed in the ships duty's Lat 19:04 S Lon 73:32 W

Wednesday June 26th

This day begins with strong breezes Bark on the port tack watch employed in the ships duty's one sail in sight at sun down the same continued middle part the same at day light and latter part strong breezes one sail in sight Bark on the starboard tack watch employed in the ships duty's Lat 19:19 S Lon 73:47 W

Thursday June 27th

This day begins with strong breezes Bark on the starboard tack watch employed in the ships duty's at sun down strong breeze continued middle part the same at day light the same watch employed in the ships duty's Lat 18:33 S Lon 73:35 W

Friday June 28th

This day begins with strong breezes Bark on the starboard tack at sun down took in sails the Bark on the port tack middle part the same at day light and latter part pleasant breeze Bark on the starboard tack watch employed in Repeating main top sail Lat 18:25 S Lon 73:44 W

Continued Friday August 16th

This day begins with pleasant breeze from S.E. Bark on the starboard tack at sun down took in sails on the starboard tack middle part wind hauled from S.W. at day light the same Bark steering to Eward son two sails watch employed in ships duty's Lat 32:50 N Lon 81:58 W

Saturday August 17th

This day begins with pleasant breeze from S.W. steering E one sail in sight at sun down took in sails steering E middle part the same at day light and latter part wind from W steering E hazy weather

Sunday 18th

This day begins with pleasant breeze from W.N.W. steering E by E at sun down wind hauled from S.W. steering E by E took in sail middle part the same at day light Isle of Juan Fernandez bearing E by E 25 miles latter land about three miles off thick and hazy weather and S.E.

Monday 19th

This day begins with strong winds from S.E. and hazy weather band in sight at times though not far at sun down took in sail on the starboard tack two strange sails in sight middle part lying off and on at day light land about twelve miles off two sails in sight at ten A.M. light winds from E Boat went ashore latter part lying off and on
