

Remarks On board B² Mary & Susan Capt. O'Gorman 1887

Sunday Apr 3rd

Commenced with a fine breeze from E. N. E. B² heading N. middle part -
Wind the same B² heading S. E. at Two P. M. light off N. by S
Latter part Wind the same B² heading S. E. at dark Diamond
Head for N. W. distance 1 mile and a half so ends

Monday 4th

Commenced with a light breeze from E. N. E. B² on different tack
middle part a light breeze from E. S. E. B² steering N. W. at
11.45 Lowered the Mast. Boat went on shore at 1.30
Latter part a fine breeze from N. E. B² on different tack hands
employed in ship duty so ends

Tuesday 5th

Commenced with a fine breeze from N. E. B² on different tack
middle part the same saw the Steamer in to day but
did not send a Boat on shore latter part Wind the same
B² working the same at dark Diamond Head for N. W. distance
about 5 miles hands employed in ship duty so ends

Wednesday 6th

Commenced with a fine breeze from N. E. B² laying off on
middle part the same at 8.30 A. M. a boat from shore
came along side and Capt. O'Gorman went. Back on
her also secured 45 Boxes Potatoes at 2.30 P. M.
Capt. Fisher came on board and his Lister went
on shore sick he went to the Hospital his dress
is the Veneral he had it when he came on board
Latter part Wind the same B² steering N. by S
so ends disposed of a Boat went on shore

Sunday Apr 17th

Commenced with a fine breeze from S. E. B² steering N. W. middle
part a light air from N. W. and died out to a Calm latter part a light
breeze from S. E. B² steering N. W. so ends Lat. 42.21 Lon 164.5

Monday 18th

Commenced with a fine breeze from S. E. B² steering N. W. middle part a
strong breeze with Rain from E. S. E. B² steering N. W. latter part a fresh
breeze with Rain from E. S. E. B² steering N. W. hands employed in
breaking out Water so ends Lat 42.16 No Lon

Tuesday 19th

Commenced with a moderate Gale from E. S. E. with Rain B² steering
N. W. middle part Wind the same B² steering N. W. at 12.30 P. M.
Wind hauled to the N. E. hove too on Starboard tack heading N. W.
Latter part a Gale from N. E. B² heading N. W. so ends
No Off

Wednesday 20th

Commenced with a moderate Gale from N. E. B² heading N. W. middle
part a fresh breeze from N. E. B² heading N. W. latter part a
strong breeze with light snow squalls from N. E. B² heading N. W.
hands employed in ship duty so ends. Lat 42.24 Lon 164.50

Thursday 21st

Commenced with a light breeze and hailing from N. E. B² heading
N. W. middle part the same B² heading N. W. latter part a Calm so ends
For Top Sails Bunt Lines also for main Boats off of second Mast
Low Line for T. G. Sheet Whips and coiled 4 Bids of new Line
so ends
