

Remarks On board B^{re} Mary & Susan Capt. Fisher 1887
Monday May 2nd

Commenced with a strong breeze from N.E. at 12 M. commenced to work the wind the same at 3.30 AM kept off working to the N.W. amongst heavy strips of ice. At 3 PM worked out of them into clear water at 8 PM came up to the ice again. B^{re} heading N.W. by the latter part a fresh breeze from N.E. B^{re} heading to the S.W. hands employed in ship duty so ends.

Lat by Obs 58.38 Lon 164.01 W

Tuesday 3rd

Commenced with a strong breeze from N.E. B^{re} heading E. middle part Wind the same B^{re} heading N.W. spoke B^{re} A. Barker & Richard William Baylis latter part calm hands employed in ship duty so ends.

Lat by Obs 57.08 Lon 161.82

Wednesday 4th

Commenced with a light breeze from N.E. B^{re} heading N.W. middle part Wind the same B^{re} working to the N.W. amongst the ice one sail in sight to the S.E. latter part a light breeze from the N. B^{re} working to the N.W. hands employed in ship duty so ends.

Lat by Obs 57.44 Lon 162.00

Thursday 5th

Commenced with a light breeze from N.W. B^{re} heading N.W. middle part a light breeze from N.W. B^{re} working to the N.W. along the ice latter part the same hands employed in ship duty spoke B^{re} Helen Mac and Stamboul so ends.

Remarks On board B^{re} Mary & Susan Capt. E. B. Fisher 1887
Sunday May 15th

Commenced with a fine breeze from N.E. at 12 M. commenced to work harked off heading E. middle part again breeze from N.E. B^{re} heading to the N.W. along the ice Kumiak Island in sight a fine E. N.E. 10 miles latter part wind the same B^{re} heading N.W. hands employed in ship duty so ends. Helen Mac in sight.

Lat by Obs 60.03 Lon 165.88

Monday 16th

Commenced with a light air from N.E. B^{re} working to the N.W. middle and latter part the same Kumiak in sight 6 miles hands employed in ship duty so ends.

Tuesday 17th

Commenced with a light breeze from E. N.E. B^{re} working to the N.W. middle part the same B^{re} amongst the ice latter part light breeze from N. B^{re} laying a beam on a different tack in the ice hands employed in ship duty so ends.

Lat by Obs 60.26

Wednesday 18th

Commenced with a fine breeze from N.E. B^{re} laying on different tacks amongst heavy ice middle part a strong breeze from same quarter B^{re} working out of it. Ice to the S.W. stood under the Longath Island and the natives came on board latter part a fresh breeze from N.E. B^{re} laying on different tacks hands employed in cleaning Hogs so ends. At dark the land bore N.E. distance ten miles.
