Log Book of SK Mary & Susan Season of 1888

Thursday March 8th

This day commenced with a strong Gale from N.W. all Hands on Board at 5 P.M. It also did not go to sea as it was blowing a gale so end this day

Friday March 9th

This day commences with a fine Breeze from the East at 9 a.m. The tug relief came and towed us over the bar and bidding us Good By at 11:00 AM made all sail heading sou west Wind West Nor West Matter Part Wind Light from North west Employed stowing cables & anchors washing down and General Ships duty 10 sails in sight so ends this day

Saturday March 10th

This day begins with a light air and Buffling Winds heading various courses Employed in fitting Boats and General Ships duty Courses West by North at 5 P.M. Wind North East Ship heading Course 7 sails in sight also sets a school of finbacks so ends this day Lat "37.05" Long "123.42"
