Employed in General Ships duty lat " 59.57.
Long " 174.48.

begins with a moderate breeze from E.N.E.
BK ~~Heading~~ Working to Eastward Last
& Pack under short sail middle & latter
Part wind the same spoke BK Eliza (and
a boat for 10 boxes potatoes) and young Philip
Employed in Reaving cutting fells guys standing out
S.E.B. and General Ships duty So ends this day

begins with a moderate Gale from
The East middle Part the same with thick
snow storm latter Part wind light and
drifting from S.E. to S. working to the
South under short sail through scattering
ice 15 sails in sight Hands Employed in
General Ships duty So ends this day

Wednesday April 24th

begins with a calm & a m light air
from S.E. middle and latter Part the
same under all sail working to the South
and East along the ice spoke BK
Reindeer & Ohio 2nd Reindeer took 15
boxes potatoes that we brought as freight
from San Francisco Employed in General
Ships duty So ends this day Lat 60.40.
Long 177.53

Wednesday April 25th

begins with a calm middle Part the
same latter wind light and drifting
from N.W. to N.N.W. BK heading S.E. by E.
along the Pack 13 sails in sight Hands
Employed in General Ships duty So ends
this day Lat 60.34. North
Long 178.44. East
