

Friday June 1st 1888

Began with a light air from the north
at anchor 1/2 mile south of Indian Point
got 6 natives to go in the arctic with us
at 10 a.m. got under way PK working
to N by E along the shore ice latter
part lying with head boards aback from
the ice employed breaking out water
and bread and general ship's duty

Saturday June 2^d

Began with a light breeze from the north
PK working to the north middle port
lying with head boards square along the
shore ice little island bearing N.W.
distance 10 miles latter part working to the
north employed repairing old flying
10 PK & 1 Stm in sight

Sunday June 3^d

Began with a fresh breeze from the N by W PK
working to the north along the shore ice
middle port the same at 1 P.M. kept off for
Indian Point - ice making across from South
Head S. Lawrence Bay to solid pack in the
middle of the straits 10 P.M. luffed to wind
with head boards aback on port tack 10 sails
at anchor south of Indian Point - 3 Stms
and 2 PK under way so end. this day

Sunday June 10th

Began with a moderate breeze from N.W.W.
PK at anchor 3 miles S.W. of Indian Point
6.30 a.m. all boats going for whales off the
Point - latter larboard & 1st Bow Boat cruising
17 PKs and 1 Schie at anchor so ends this day

Monday June 11th

Began with a light air from N.W.W.
PKs at anchor at Indian Point larboard
and Port Boat - cruising sighted two whales
came aboard without success 17 PKs & 1 Schie
at anchor at Indian Point - 3 Stms and 1 PK
under way so ends this day

Tuesday June 12th

Began at anchor S.W. of Indian Point
all boats off cruising for whales came aboard
at 5 P.M. without success 17 PKs Schie and
Stms anchored around us 8 P.M. got under
way wind N course S.W. by W. along
the land broke out water so ends this
day
