most part fresh breezes and fair weather Steer
different courses, employ washing bone
and other goods, latter part only 2 ships in sight
Lat 57.46 N

Thursday June 21st

most part moderate breezes from S.W. to S.E.
Steer by the wind and different tacks, A.M. in
company with the Jancaster, A.M. 10 ships
in sight 3 Boiling employ in ships duty

Friday June 22nd

A.M. fine breezes from the S. mostly clear weather
Steer different courses, saw about 20 ships,
A.M. light air and thick fog, lay too most
of the time near the ice, employ at various jobs,
Lat 56.26 N

Saturday June 23rd

most part of the 24 hours moderate breezes from
S. to S.E. thick and foggy weather, lay aback most
of time, clear in with the ice, employ various
operation keep 4 Bl. Post, Lat 56.22 N

Sunday June 24th

most part of the 24 hours moderate breezes from N.E.
to S.E. lay aback most of the time along the
ice, saw several ships, Lat 56.27 N.
Jones Island dist by estimation 40 miles

Monday June 25th

A.M. moderate breezes at N.E. with thick fog,
lay aback most of the time, spoke bark Harmony
of N. London, one whale, A.M. the fog cleared
up, wind light from the N. Steer by the wind on
different tacks about the ice, saw one whale on
rising, saw about 30 ships 2 of them Boiling
spoke the Omega of V. Haven, 5 Whales
Lat 56.13 N

Remarks Tuesday June 26th

most part of the 24 hours moderate breezes from
N.E. to S.E. first part fair, latter part mostly
thick and foggy Steer different courses, part of the time
lay aback, employ in ships duty Lat 56.11 N

Wednesday

Thursday June 27th

A.M. moderate breezes from the eastward most part
thick fog, at 8 P.M. fog cleared off, saw two whales
brought two boats without success, A.M. light variable
winds and calm, mostly clear weather, hauled all the boats
and went in the ice, found a dead whale commenced towing
him to the ship, saw about 20 ships, no oil

Thursday June 28th

first part clear and fine weather, light air from the S.
at 7 A.M. got the whale to the ship, at 9 commenced
cutting, at 2 A.M. finished, latter moderate breezes at S.
most part foggy, employ Boiling Lat 56.30 N
ice in all directions.

Friday June 29th

all the 24 hours fine breezes from S. to S.E. most part
clear weather, steer by the wind on different tacks,
A.M. finished Boiling, saw a great many pinbacks
and spears, left the ice to the N. several ships
steering S.W. Lat 56.24 N

Saturday June 30th

A.M. fine breezes from the eastward and fair weather
Steer S.W. & S.W. employ washing bone,
A.M. wind from E. S.E. to E. N. E. cloudy and foggy
latter part Steer W. S.W. saw three ships
employ stowing down oil, start side main haul
Aft. opened turn of Bl. Post, no oil
