

Saturday August 18th 1855.
 first part light air and calm clear and fine weather,
 middle part strong breeze from the N. and stormy, very
 rough sea, at 10 P.M. a boat came alongside from the
 Bark Scatterman, and remained all night, she had cut
 from a whale, it being too rough to lay by him. latter part
 light air and calm, 3 boats cruising for whales
 employed Boiling, not so many whales seen this day.

Sunday August 19th
 most part of the 24 hours moderate variable wind and fair
 weather, 4 boats cruising for whales, towed the 5th boat
 and picked up a dead whale, got him to the ship at 3 A.M.
 and cut him in. Sold an Anchor and 30 fms cable
 to Bark Harvest of Fairhaven, so end.

Monday August 20th
 mostly moderate variable winds and fair weather,
 A.M. 3 boats off cruising for whales, the others employed
 Boiling and at other jobs. Saw but few whales and then
 very shy, did not strike.

Tuesday August 21st
 P.M. moderate breeze and calm, cloudy unsettled weather
 3 boats off cruising for whales. W. Boat got a small
 whale, got him to the ship at 9 P.M. A.M. fine breeze
 from S.W. 3 boats off, saw a few whales, did not strike
 cut in the whale.

Wednesday August 22nd
 most part of the 24 hours moderate breeze and calm
 with fine weather, 3 boats cruising. Saw but few whales
 P.M. employed Boiling and stowing down oil. started side
 to hold fast side. A.M. Boiling Brackishant
 Shunk heads &c. 3 boats cruising without success.

Thursday August 23rd
 most part of the 24 hours moderate variable winds
 cloudy unsettled weather. P.M. 3 boats cruising for whales
 employed on Board Boiling, setting up shooks &c. at 8 P.M. finished
 Boiling. A.M. all the boats on board, finished stowing down
 the 4 whales made 120 lbs. very few whales seen this day.

Friday August 24th
 P.M. fine breeze from the N. and fair weather, employed
 stowing off the hold, and other jobs. at 8 P.M. got underway
 and stood out into middle of the Bay, anchored again.
 A.M. light air and calm, 3 boats cruising for whales, saw
 only a few, employed setting up shooks &c.

Saturday August 25th
 P.M. light wind from the Eastward and fine weather, 3 boats off
 at 1 P.M. got underway and stood to the N. at 6 anchored
 at 6 anchored in 12 fms water, about 6 miles from West head
 of Shantier Bay, 5 ships at anchor off the head, only one Boiling.
 Several ships underway bound to the N.W. A.M. moderate breeze
 at 6 took our anchor and stood to the N. sent off all the boats
 saw only 2 whales, at 11 took up the boats,
 at Noon S.W. head large Shantier Bearing N.E. dist 10 miles.

Sunday August 26th
 most part of the 24 hours moderate breeze and variable
 some calms, middle part Rain. at 6 P.M. Anchored
 off Fickelstopp Bay, 12 fms water, 5 ships at anchor, one
 Boiling, a stinker to the E. &c. 6 A.M. took our anchor worked
 up towards the Passage between Shantier and Fickelstopp.
 sent 2 boats along shore no whales seen, so end.
