

1855 Ship Mary Pradier, Bound to Sandwich Island, Dec 1st

Friday, Dec 1st 1855

most part of the 24 hours smart breeze from the East
A.M. some squally. Steered S.W. all sail set
employed at various jobs. Lat 20. 58 N
Long 154. 00 W

Saturday Dec 2nd

A.M. smart breeze from the N.E. Cloudy unsettled weather
with some rain. first part steered S.W. by S. at 4 P.M.
saw a light on Mysee, bearing S.W. Middle part
lay to. latter part moderate easterly wind. Cloudy with
showers. at daylight steered of N.W. for Hilo.
at 10 A.M. Capt. started for shore. Harbours dist
about 12 miles.
opened three B. & B. B.

Sunday Dec 3rd

A.M. moderate variable winds. Cloudy with some rain.
A.M. fine breeze at N.E. Passing. Clouds. Rough sea
standing off and on at Hilo. Capt. on shore.
Lat Obs 19. 38 N
Long by Obs 155. 00 W

Monday Dec 4th

all the 24 hours fresh trades at N.E. and squally
very rough sea. at 6 P.M. Boat returned from shore.
Brought 2 quarters Beef 600 oranges, 4 B. & B. Sweet Potatoes.
Steered off N.W. for Maunaloa

about 10 A.M. John Berry died. he has been
sick more than two months. Suppose the consumption
he was a seaman and was joined the ship last fall
at these islands.

Ship Mary Pradier at the Sandwich Islands, Dec 1st 1855

Tuesday Dec 5th 1855

all the 24 hours light airs and calm. Clear and fine weather.
at 2 P.M. Capt. started off the Anchorage at Maunaloa.
Capt. went on shore. Middle and latter part lay off and on
P.M. buried John Berry.

Wednesday Dec 6th

first part light airs and calm. Clear weather. at 10 P.M.
Capt. came on board. Middle part strong trades steered
for calm. at 9 A.M. took a Pilot and went into harbour.
at 10 came to anchor. Latter part employed moving ship.
this day contains 36 hours

Thursday Dec 7th

A.M. cloudy unsettled weather with some rain. P.M. fair
weather. Worked ashore on liberty. watch on board
cleaning from work. the three Kanakas that were
taken from the Washington went on shore. also J. Sylvia.
left the ship on Wednesday night without leave and has not
been on board.

Friday Dec 8th

most part clear and fine weather. one watch on liberty.
the other employed at various jobs
