Saturday Decr 22nd 1858

fine and middle part fair weather wind from the S.
latter part squally with rain wind to employed at various
jobs. Painted Star Side.

American Consul to ascertain if they could have any
more liberty. They all went on shore to the Consul
what the result of the interview was. I have not learned

Sunday Decr 23rd

most part of the day cloudy unsettled weather
with some rain, wind from S to W. all hands on
liberty. Dr. Lick. Remained on shore without
leave.

Monday Decr 24th

fresh trades and fair weather throughout
employed at various jobs. Delivered a boat
and 7 coils twine to Ship Humphreys

for Honolulu Harbor, S.I.

Tuesday Decr 25th

fair weather throughout the day employed at various
jobs. Dr. Lick came on board after being absent 36 hours

Wednesday Decr 26th

fresh trades and fair weather. employed Breasting and
cooping the oil between decks. cooped 11 Pipes

Thursday Decr 27th

fair weather throughout the day. employed cooping
oil. Storing same &c.
Gills came on board to act cook or steward.

Friday Decr 28th

fair weather throughout the day employed at various
jobs. got 10 Pipes water on board. Delivered 20 lbs.

Saturday Decr 29th

fair weather throughout the day. employed variously
and 6 casks Bricks, 22 lbs. of
Salt 1310 lbs coal for fuel

Sunday Decr 30th

A.M. variable winds with some rain.
P.M. fair weather. Most of the crew on liberty

Monday Decr 31st

fair weather throughout the day. employed at
various jobs. Delivered some old copper to
Spencer.
