

Ship Mary Duggan - At Cape Horn, 1856.

Friday April 11th 1856.
first part fresh breezes at N.N.W. Cloudy and overcast
middle part strong breezes from N.W. to N.
thick and drizzly. at 10 P.M. carried away E.D.M.
standing sail down. at 4 A.M. hauled the light
sails. latter part strong breezes at N.N.E.
Course E. by compass. Noobs lat height 55. 10 N
long 83. 00 W.

Saturday April 12th
all these 24 hours fresh breezes at N.N.E.
most part cloudy and drizzly. Steered by the wind
to the Eastward. A.M. hauled M.D. & sail.
lat 56. 12 S
long 79. 49 W.

Sunday April 13th
first part of these 24 hours fresh breezes at N.N.E.
Middle part wind hauled to N.W. latter part
strong breezes from N.W. to N. Cloudy
and overcast throughout the day.
Steered E. N. E. Noobs lat by lat 56. 25 S.
long 75. 00 W.

Monday April 14th
Commenced with strong breezes at N.N.W.
thick and overcast. Middle part strong gale
at N. very high sea. Close reefed the topsails
Steered E. N. E. & E. at 10 A.M. Roped the
Diego Islands. Dist 3.00 p. Miles. it being thick
and foggy. with very rough sea. latter part
gale abated some. turned out the tops. Steered
to the Eastward. No obs. lat 56. 40 S
long 68. 20 W.

Ship Mary Duggan Crossing the South Atlantic
towards home. - April 1856.

Tuesday April 15th 1856.
first part fresh gales at N. Cloudy and overcast.
Steered E. Middle part moderate breeze. Steered N.E.
latter part strong gale at S.W. cloudy and
squally. Steered N.N.E. by compass.
saw two ships bound to the Westward.
lat 55. 48 S
long 74. 00 W.

Wednesday April 16th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the S.W. very
high sea. Steered N.N.E. & N.E. by N. by compass.
Carried whole M.D. sail, and M.D. & sail most
of the time. latter part saw a sail leading to the
S. lat 53. 20 S
long 89. 22 W.

Thursday April 17th
first part fresh gales at S.W. Cloudy and hazy
Steered N.N.E. at 3 P.M. Roped Bauchins
Island. Dist from it 6. or 8. miles.
Middle and latter part moderate breezes from
the S. and fair weather. Steered N.E. by N.
latter part Steered N. all sail set.
at noon Fast Falkland in sight to the Westward
Dist 25 or 30 Miles. lat 51. 35 S
long 56. 50 W.

Friday April 18th
most part of these 24 hours fine breezes from S.W.
Bunching clouds and fair weather. Steered N. & N. by N.
A.M. saw a bark standing to the S.
employed in ships duty. lat 49. 05 S
long 56. 09 W.

Saturday April 19th
first part fresh breezes at S.W. Cloudy and foggy.
Middle part strong gale. Close reefed the topsails
latter part gale abated. turned out the tops. & set M.D. & sail.
Steered N. Bunching clouds and fair weather.
opened Bunch & Bark lat 46. 17 S
long 54. 44 W.
