Sunday April 20th 1856.

Commenced with moderate breezes at N.
Middle and latter part fresh breezes from N. to
S.W. hazy weather. Steered N. & N.N.E.
latter part hauled D.G. sails.
Saw several finbacks
Lat 44. 07 S.
Long 53. 11 W.

Monday April 21st

first and middle part smart breezes at N.W.
Passing clouds and fair weather. latter part
Moderate variable winds and calm.
Cloudy Rainy unsettled weather.
Steered to the N.
Lat 42. 58 S
Long 52. 12 W.

Tuesday April 22nd

Commenced with fresh breezes at N.W. and fair
weather. Steered by the wind to N.E. middle
part strong breezes. Cloudy with some rain.
double reefed the topsails. hauled jib & mainsail
latter part strong breezes at S.W. Steered N.
Lat 41. 22 S
Long 50. 10 W.

Wednesday April 23rd

all these 24 hours strong breezes from S.W. to
N.W. Passing clouds and fair weather.
Steered N.N.W. by compass. A.M. turned out
traps & set M.D. G. sail. employed in ships
duty.
Lat 38. 10 S
Long 51. 00 W.

Thursday April 24th

all these 24 hours strong breezes from the Westward
Passing clouds and fair weather. Steered by the
wind to the N. employed variously.
A.M. saw a sail standing to S.W.
Lat 36. 21 S
Long 50. 11

Towards Horn April 1856.

Friday April 25th 1856.

all these 24 hours strong breezes from Westward,
Passing clouds and fair weather. Steered by the
wind to the N. A.M. double reefed the topsails
employed in ships duty. A.M. saw two sail.
Lat 33. 20
Long 50. 00

Saturday April 26th

all these 24 hours moderate breezes from N.W. S.W.
with fair weather. Steered N.N.E. all sail set
employed at various jobs. Saw several sail.
Not hauled as usual.
Lat 31. 28 S
Long 48. 40 W.

Sunday April 27th

first part moderate breezes from S.W. to S. and
S.E. Middle and latter part fine breezes from
E. to N.E. fair weather. Steered to the N. all
sail set. Saw several small vessels.
Lat 29. 07 S.
Long 49. 04 W.

Monday April 28th

first part fine breezes at N.E. hazy and smoky
weather. Steered by the wind to N.N.W.
at 6 P.M. saw the land to the N.W. Dist 12, or
15 miles. Landed and got 30 fms water.
Tacked to the Eastward. Middle part strong
breezes from the N. hauled D.G. sails and
double reefed the topsails. latter part more
moderate turned out traps.
Employed at various jobs.
Lat 29. 16 S
Long 49. 11 W.

Tuesday April 29th

first part of these 24 hours fresh breezes at N. to
N.N.W. Clear weather. Middle part light
airs from N. to S. latter part fine breezes from
E. to S.W. Steered by the wind to the N.
A.M. started traps up to
apine trap & back.
Lat 28. 24
Long 48. 34
