

1858 In the Ochoa Sea
 Tuesday May 3 Strong S.W. wind A.M. saw jcs. sturd off to the eastward to clear it. Lat 53° 50' W Long 148° 28'

Wednesday May 4 fresh breezes from S.W. and clear weather. sturd by the wind to N.W. A.M. got into the jcs seven ships in sight. Lat 55° 00' W Long 149° 30' E

Thursday Nov 15 1858 A.M. first part strong breezes at N.W. Clear weather. Middle and latter part light winds from N to E. Course E.S.E. employed variously got the boom on deck to wash. Lat 32° 15' W Long 162° 44' W

Friday Nov 16 all these 24 hours moderate breezes from the eastward clear and fine weather sturd by the wind to the S. all sail set. employed variously commenced washing boom. Lat 32° 41' W Long 161° 35' W

Wednesday Nov 17 all these 24 hours moderate breezes from S.E. to S.W. and W. Clear and fine weather. Course S.E. & E. employed washing boom. Lat 31° 53' S Long 160° 59' W

Thursday Nov 18 all these 24 hours light variable wind and calm clear and fine weather making very little progress towards port. employed washing boom. Lat 31° 34' W Long 160° 23' W

Friday Nov 19 light airs from S to S.E. and calm clear and fine weather. sturd by the wind to the eastward. A.M. finished washing boom. Lat 31° 32' W Long 159° 45' W

Saturday Nov 20 A.M. light airs from the S. A.M. fine breezes sturd by the wind to the eastward. Lat 31° 20' W Long 158° 17' W

Sunday Nov 21 moderate breezes throughout A.M. from S.S.W. to N. A.M. from W to N. Cloudy with some rain sturd S.E. Lat 30° 10' W Long 157° 10' W

1858 Bound in to Sandwich Islands
 Monday Nov 22 A.M. fresh breezes from the N. Cloudy and raining sturd S.E. A.M. trade wind set in from E. N.E. sturd by the wind. Saw a sail on weather quarter. employed washing ship. Lat 28° 14' W Long 156° 45' W

Tuesday Nov 23 fresh trades from E. throughout the day. A.M. hauled july jib and V.L. sails sturd by the wind to the S.E. the ship that was in sight yesterday. in sight all this day. at sunset off Leeward. 6 miles Dist. Lat 26° 40' W Long 156° 15' W

Wednesday Nov 24 most trades from E. to E.S.E. sturd by the wind to the S. the same sail in sight all day. eastern 12 to 14 miles Dist. Lat 23° 15' W Long 155° 51' W

Thursday Nov 25 fine breezes at E. by S. fair weather sturd by the wind at daylight saw Mowee & Malokie, the Passage being S.E. at 10 A.M. E. end Malokie S.E. 2 points on weather beam. Dist 2 or 3 miles tacked to the N. at noon tacked to the S. Lat 21° 26' W Long 155° 46' W

Friday Nov 26 most part moderate trades at E. A.M. went ashore at Mowee. to make enquires about meters and things.

Saturday Nov 27 A.M. light airs and calm got on Beach and left for Oahu. first part calm middle part heavy rain strong wind and calm. Remained in the offing between the three islands all night. Sailed
