Sunday Nov the 2
this day commences with light winds
rain squalls and calms all from
the Southward the Ship on the S
tack sundown the same pump Ship Mud
and later parts calms
and squalls from the Southward
a Bark in sight off the lee beam
thus ends the 40 day

Lat 05 28 N Long 28 56 W Course by the wind on different tacks

Monday Nov the 3
this day commences with rain squalls
and light winds from the S E the
Ship on the L tack sundown
strong breeze from the S took
in the Fore and Miz S & Sails and
flying jell and pump Ship Mud
and later part strong breeze
from the S E the S E trade winds
I believe thus ends the 41 day

Lat 14 22 N Long 28 53 W Course by the wind heading S W by S

Tuesday Nov the 4
this day commences with strong
breezes from S E and pleasant
weather Sundown the same
pump Ship Mud and later
fine breezes from the S E
thus ends the 42 day
and 6 weeks

Lat 2 16 N Long 30 30 by Sun at 30 30
Long 30 38 W Course by the wind head S S W

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Wednesday Nov the 5
this day commences with strong breezes
from the S E and pleasant weather
Sundown the same pump Ship Mud
and later parts strong breezes from
the S E one Ship in sight
thus ends the 43 day

Lat 00 21 N Long 31 11 W Course by the wind heading S S W

Thursday Nov the 6
this day commences with strong winds
from the S E about 4 1/2 P M crossed
the line Sundown strong breezes
from the S E by S pump Ship across
the line Mud and later parts strong
breezes down the mid part tack Ship
and stood to the Eastward at 6 P M
tack back to the S S W pointed the
Larboard Bow
thus ends the 44 day
Course by the wind

Lat 00 37 S Long 31 40 W

Friday Nov the 7
this day commences with strong wind
from the S E sundown the same
pump Ship Mud and later parts the
same
thus ends the 45 day

Lat 2 38 S Long 32 11 W Course by the wind
