Friday Dec the 19
this day commences with light winds from the westward breaking out Water Sundown the same Charles Sashure off duty sick with a bulr in the ground also the Cooper sick Mid part strong breezes from the S.W. later part light from the N one Ship in sight thus ends the 87 day

Saturday Dec the 20
this day commences with calms one Ship in sight Sundown the same Charles Sashure off duty sick with a bulr the Cooper on duty Mid part strong breezes from the S.W. later part a Gale S.W. a Portuguese fell from the main Top sail laid wide parting the Sail down between the rigging and Mast Boat did not hurt himself very bad

Sunday the 21 Dec
this day commences with a severe Gale from the S.W. Sundown more moderate Charles Sashure off duty sick with a bulr in the ground also the Portuguese that fell from aloft Mid part calm later part fine breeze from the Westward got some lunar observations

this day commences with pleasant weather and a fine breeze from the S.W. Sundown the same Charles Sashure off duty sick with a bulr in the ground also the Portuguese that fell from aloft Mid part fine breeze from the S.W. later part strong from the S.W. & to the S.W. thus ends the 90 day

Tuesday Dec the 23
this day commences with fine breeze from the Westward Sundown from the S.W. Charles Sashure off duty sick with a bulr the Cooper off duty again he says that he is sick I do not believe it the Portuguese that fell from aloft off duty his legs are very sore Mid part strong breeze from the S.W. later part the same thus ends the 91 day

Wednesday Dec the 24
this day commences with strong breeze from the S.W. at 2 o'clock P.M. one of the Falklands saw Favos Island one of the Falkland Islands tacked Ship and stood to the Westward Sundown the same Charles Sashure and the Cooper and one Portuguese on the deck Mid part moderate Gale from the S.W. & later part fine weather the wind from the S thus ends the 92 day
