1859

Friday March the 13
this day commences with moderate
breeze from the N bent the
chains Sundown strong breeze
the cooper off duty Sick
Mid part strong breeze from
the N at 10 PM tacked Ship and
stood the Eastward at 2 AM tacked
back at 4 AM made the E end
of Ottawa later part light wind
from the N to the N W
course N W by W

Lat 18 40 N Long 154 50 W

Saturday March the 14
this day commences with light
winds and rain at 2 PM took
a Pilot for Hilo at sundown
the same the Harbour bearing
W S W about 8 miles Dist the
cooper off duty sick at 7 PM o'clock
came to anchor and furled the
sails mid and later parts raine
thus ends the 172 day and our
passage from New Bedford to
Hilo

in the Port of Hilo

Sunday March the 15 one Watch
on liberty Monday the 16 the
same getting on board Water
Tuesday the 17 Stowing and getting
on board Water one Watch on
liberty Wednesday getting
Water and on liberty
Thursday the same Friday
rain on liberty Saturday
liberty Sunday the same
Monday took some Provisions
on Shore and got for Sea.

On Monday March
the 16th discharged
the cooper sickness
was the cause
Thursday the carpenter
deserted and on Friday
was taken again Sunday
the 22 three men deserted
Nathan Jenson Edward
Burston and the cook

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Tuesday the 24
all ready for took the carpenter on
board heard nothing from the other
deserters as yet all ready for sea
thus ends the

Wednesday March the 25
this day commences with fine weather
at 3 PM took a Pilot and got under
weigh the Capt on Shore at 5 PM the
Pilot left us at 1 PM the Capt came
on board and sailed to the N W at 10
PM steering W S W Mid part fine breeze
from E S E later part steering S W
bound in to Tooe for potatoes
thus ends the day

Thursday March the 26
this day commences with light air and
calm the W end of Owhyhee bearing
E S E about 5 miles off at 2 PM the Capt
went on shore sundown the same
Mid and later parts light breeze
W to S W Laying off and on at
Tooe the Capt on shore
thus ends the day
