Friday March the 27
this day commences light airs from
the S.W. the Capt on shore
Sundown the same the Capt
came on board and put a gal
from the S.W. later part Calm
laying off and on at toe waiting
for potatoes
thus ends the day

Laying off and on at toe

Saturday March the 28
this day commences with light airs
from the S.W. the boat went
on shore to see if the potatoes
was ready will be ready in the
morning. Sundown rain and
calm the land about 2 miles
distant and part calm later part
took on board 40 bls of potatoes
light breeze from the W
thus ends the day
Laying off and on at toe

Sunday March the 29
this day commences with light
breeze from the W. left toe
for the leeward Islands
Sundown the same. Mid part
calm later part S.E. Trades
at noon came in sight of the
Shipping in Harbour of Lahaina.
The Capt very sick with the
diarrhea
thus ends the day
Course N.W. by W.

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Monday March the 30
commences with Calm and light airs
from the E at 4 P.M. I went on shore
the Capt being sick and unable to go
to see if we could get a cooper cook
and some foremast hands and found
they was there to be got and put laying
off and on later the Capt went on
shore being somewhat better
thus ends the day

Laying off and on at Lahaina

Tuesday March the 31
commences with fine weather laying
off and on sundown heavy rain storm
and part the 2 Officer J. Phillips
had a fit in very severe one. This
is the 4th since we left home. later
part laying off and on fine weather
thus ends the day

Laying off and on at Lahaina

Wednesday April the 1
this day commences with Calm the
Ship laying off and on at 5 P.M.
came to an anchor at Lahaina
the later part Discharged the
2 Officer J. Phillips on account
of his having fits. Thursday the 2
lowered for Humphreys, did not
get on. Shipped another 2 Officer
a cooper and cook and one foremast
hand
thus ends the last day in Lahaina
