Friday May the 30th
this day commences with strong breezes from E sundown
more moderate saw Sea to the S E and later
parts calm lat 56 14 this ends the day

Saturday May the 31
this day commences with light breezes from the W S W
at 8 P M saw and lowered for a Whale without success
at 8 P M lowered without success two Ships in sight
Mid part strong breezes from W at 8 P M lowered for
Whales without success later part strong breezes from
W S W three Ships in sight thus ends the day

Sunday June the 1st
this day commences with strong breezes from W S W
at 5 P M lowered for Whales without success stowing
down oil on the Starboard Main hold sundown the
same mid part strong breezes S W later part the same
at 10 A M saw Whales lowered the West Boat struck and
Larboard Boat killed him at noon took him alongside
thus ends the day

Monday June the 2
this day commences with strong breezes from S stowing
down oil on the Main hold sundown the same
the Whale alongside mid part stowing down oil
Later part commences cutting strong breezes from
S to S E thus ends the day

Tuesday June the 3
this day commences cutting with strong breezes from S E
at 5 P M got through cutting commences boiling mid
part strong breezes S E later part the same with
snow storm thus ends the day

Wednesday June the 4
this day commences snow storm with strong breezes
from S S E sundown calm foggy and boiling mid
and later part strong breezes from E to S E
saw no Whales thus ends the day

Thursday June the 5
this day commences with strong breezes from W E sundown
moderate mid part the same later part moderate
gale from S E saw two Ships no Whales
thus ends the day

Friday June the 6
this day commences with moderate gale from S E sundown
the same saw 9 Ships and Bark mid part the same
daylight Sea and Ships later part strong breezes from
S E and fog breaking out shoos thus ends the day

Saturday June the 7
this day commences with strong breezes from S E stowing
down oil sundown the same broke out fog later
mid and later moderate from S E thick fog stowing down
thus ends the day

Sunday June the 8
this day commences with light breezes from S E sundown
from S thick fog mid and later part light from W
foggy saw no Sea and two Ships no Whales
thus ends the day

Monday June the 9
this day commences light breezes from W wash Ship
Sea in sight sundown the same mid part calm
later part light from S W to S two Ships in sight
no Whales thus ends the day

Tuesday June the 10
this day commences with light from S W saw Sea the to S
sundown the same mid and later parts thick fog Sea
in sight no Whales thus ends the day lat 56 24 N

Wednesday June the 11
this day commences with the wind from S to S E at 4 P M
saw a Whale and lowered without success sundown
the same mid part fog later part saw a Whale going
quick to the S light air from S E thus ends the day

Thursday June the 12
this day commences with light breezes from S E Sea in
sight to S W sundown the same spoke the Ship
California one Whale this season mid part fog
later part saw two Whales going quick to S lowered
without success thus ends the day lat 56 20 N

Friday June the 13
this day commences with fog and moderate breezes from
S E saw a Whale lowered without success sundown the
same mid part fog later part saw a Whale lowered the
Boats saw him no more light breezes from S S E
one Ship in sight thus ends the day
