Saturday August the 22

This day commences with fine weather wind from the West wind the North shore about 2 miles East sundown spoke the Ship Vineyard & Whales this season must and later part light breezes from N.E. three Ships in sight thick weather

thus ends the day

Sunday August the 23

This day commences with thick weather light breezes from N. Shute Island bearing about S also the main land to the N. breaking out provisions Beef Pork Bread and Butter mid part light breezes from N. later part strong breezes from N.E. with rain and thick weather spoke the Ship Vineyard

thus ends the day

Monday August the 24

This day commences with fine breezes from N.W. also strong for Board Island sundown for the N.E. head mid part fine later part the same N.E. head about 2 miles East bearing S

thus ends the day

Tuesday August the 25

This day commences fine breezes from S.W. 11 Ships in sight sundown anchored about 6 miles from squirrel Island daylight took the anchor and steered over toward Marching head two Boats gone into Shante Bay saw one Whale

thus ends the day

Wednesday August the 25

This day commences with calm sundown anchored under the South head later part saw a number of Whales the Bow Boat went on to one the Boatmen fell down did not get fast this is the second time that he has made a bad work of it

thus ends the day

Thursday August the 26

This day commences with the Ship laying at anchor the Boats off saw a few Whales later part the same

thus ends the day

Friday August the 27

This day moved the Ship in Shante Bay sundown anchored again later part got under weigh and anchored under the little Shante Boats of

This day laying at anchor under little Shante Boat off saw two Whales

Sunday August the 23

This day Boats off saw nothing latter part got under weigh and stood to the Westward saw two Whales did not lower

This day commences with spoke the Ship Green two Whales this season sundown anchored on the N. Shore daylight got under weigh and went to the N.W.

thus ends the day

Tuesday Sept the 1

This day strong breezes from the N. sundown anchored under Feklor daylight got under weigh bound to the Westward saw one Whale

thus ends the day

Wednesday Sept the 2

This day commences strong breezes from N.E. saw two Whales going quick to the N. sundown anchored saw Whales daylight got under weigh and went to the N. spoke the Ship Cornelius Howland

thus ends the day

Thursday Sept the 3

This day commences calm the N. Shore 3 miles off saw Whales the Far Boat darted did not get fast mid part lay aback the wind E later part the wind N.E. saw nothing

thus ends the day

Friday Sept the 4

This day commences with light breezes from the N.E. mid part the same later part saw number of Whales without success

thus ends the day

Saturday Sept the 5

This day commences with strong breeze and rain mid part the same later part a gale from N.E. with heavy rain

thus ends the day

Sunday Sept the 6

This day commences with a gale from N.E. mid part the same later part moderate no Whales
