Tuesday Oct the 19

This day commences with a light breeze from the S. Sundown the same Stowed over 100 bbls of oil this day Mid part light breeze from S.W. to W later the same clearing down thus ends the day

Lat 53° 30' N Long 148° 17' E Course E.S.E.

Wednesday Oct the 20

This day commences with light breezes from the W.S.W. Sundown the same got through Stowing down the thrug Whales stowed about 205 bbls Mid and later parts moderate breezes from S.W. to W thus ends the day

Lat 53° 06' N Long 148° 13' E Course S.E. by E

Thursday Oct the 21

This day commences with light breezes from S.W. Sundown calm and fair Mid and later parts fine breezes from S.W. broke out Molasses Sup Lat 51° 45' thus ends the day

Long 151° 50' E Course S.E.

Friday Oct the 22

This day commences with fine breezes from S.W. Sundown light from W. Mid and later parts light breeze and thick weather with rain squalls saw 4 porpoises thus ends the day

no Lat or Long Course S.E.

Saturday Oct the 23

This day commences with moderate breezes from S.W. at 2 P.M. saw two Right Whales lowered without success thick snow squalls sundown a gale from S.W. at 4 P.M. hailed on the wind to the S.W. thick could not see the land got no lat since Thursday Midnight when Ship stood on the Harbour back until daylight heep off and steered S.E. by S later part a gale from W to W.S.W. with thick snow squalls thus ends the day

Sunday Oct the 24

This day commences with a gale from W made the Island of Makianum at 2 P.M. Ouelatan at 3 P.M. Chunks also Paramouchie took in the West and bow Boats on deck Sundown through the Passage with a strong W wind Mid and later parts the same unbenet the Chunks and unrove the Cutty pulls thus ends the day

Lat 48° 42' N Long 158° 40' E Course E.S.E.

Monday Oct the 25

This day commences with strong W winds Sundown the same Mid and later parts the same Hume Sherman off duty sick ruptured thus ends the day

Lat 47° 15' N Long 162° 50' E Course E.S.E.

Tuesday Oct the 26

This day commences with a gale from W at 4 P.M. split the Main top galent Sail Sundown double reefed the topsails heavy hal squalls Mid part the same later part more moderate thus ends the day

Lat 45° 54' N Long 166° 49' E Course E.S.E.

Wednesday Oct the 27

This day commences with strong breezes from W.S.W. sent down the Main top galent sail to mend it sundown the same all sail put Mid and later parts moderate from S.W. to S split the Flying gill thus ends the day

Lat 44° 57' N Long 170° 18' E Course E by S

Thursday Oct 28

This day commences with moderate breezes from S. mending flying gill Sundown light from S.W. & Mid part moderate from S. & later part strong from E.S.E. with rain thus ends the day

Lat 44° 50' N Long 172° 00' E Course E.

Friday Oct the 29

This day commences with strong breezes from S.E. Sundown from E. to E.S.E. with rain Mid part strong from E later calm making line covers and scraping Bone thus ends the day

Lat 44° 30' N Long 172° 27' E Course S.E.
