This day commences with moderate breezes from
E & S and later parts light from E & S
Washing Bone thus ends the day
Lat 27 15 N Long 156 25 W course made S by E

Friday Nov the 13th
This day commences with light breezes from E & S
Sun down the same pushed Washing the Bone
Ship part calm later part shot a Sun back from the
Ship with the Bomb lance he went off spotting then
Blood lowered to Boat could not catch him Drying
Bone calm thus ends the day
Lat 26 47 N Long 156 24 W course made SE by S

Saturday Nov the 14th
This day commences light air from the E & S and later
the same Mud and later parts light from E & S
Drying Bone thus ends the day
Lat 25 59 N Long 156 28 W course made S

Sunday Nov the 15th
This day commences with light breezes from E & S
Drying and Bundling Bone Sun down the same
Mud 33 Bundles of Bone Mud and later parts light
breezes from E & S to E Drying Bone thus ends the day
Lat 24 29 N Long 156 45 W course made E S W

Monday Nov the 16th
This commences with light breezes from SE made 34
Bundles of Bone Sun down the same Mud part
same later part strong from SE at 3 PM tacked
Ship and headed ESE Drying Bone
thus ends the day
Lat 23 54 N Long 156 22 W course made SE

Tuesday Nov the 17th
This day commences with strong breezes from
SE & S and later parts strong from SE to SE
Mud and later parts strong from SE to SE
saw two Ships to the Eastward Washing Ship
no observation thus ends the day

Wednesday Nov the 18th
This day commences with strong breezes from S
Sun down from SE & Mud and later parts light from
SE & S Washing Ship and Boat caught six Porpoises
thus ends the day
Lat 22 47 N Long 152 32 W

Thursday Nov the 15th

this day commences with light breezes from S and later
SE & Mud and later parts from SE to S sent up
the Mizen topgallant mast thus ends the day
Lat 22 15 N Long 153 42 W

Friday Nov the 16th
this day commences with four breezes from the S
sent aloft the Fore topgallant mast Sun down
the same Mud and later parts moderate from S
Drying Bone at 8 o'clock I spruck three Portuguese
for not doing as I told them thus ends the day
Lat 21 48 N Long 153 41 W

Saturday Nov the 17th
this day commences with moderate breezes from S
Bundling Bone finished the Bone in all 100
Bundles Sun down light from SE & S and later
Hawke in sight Baring S W and S Mud and later
parts the same thus ends the day
Lat 21 24 N Long 154 30 W by Lunar Observed 154 37 W

Sunday Nov the 18th
this day commences with light breezes from S and later
the same Hawke in sight to the S 50 miles off
Mud part the hauled to the S with a fine breeze
later part same saw a Ship at 10 AM made the
Land to the S thus ends the day
Lat 20 21 N Long 154 50 W course S

Monday Nov the 19th
this day commences with strong breezes and rain
squalls from SE by E at 4 PM bent the Chains
and got the Anchors of the Bow sun down laying
off and on at 4 PM 4 Ships at anchor the land
from 8 to 10 miles distant Mud part strong breezes
from SE & S with rain Day light saw the E end of
Hawke started of for Hilo at 10 AM a Pilot came
on board did not employ him the Capt went on
shore the about 5 miles of light winds from SE &
and Rain thus ends the day

Tuesday Nov the 20th
this day commences with calm and thick weather
laying off and on cannot see the Land at 4 PM saw
the Boat coming of saw the Land also about 1 mile
off at sun down come to anchor outside the reef
at 19 fathoms off water at 8 PM got under weigh
