thus ends the day

this day commences with light air from S.W.E Misk part the same later part from N. Warming the cabin painting Larb Boat inside repairing sails
thus ends the day

Friday March the 5

this day commences with light air from S.W. Misk part from S.W. Depart later part saw a Sail to the Eastward light breezes from S.W.
thus ends the day

Lat 07 26 N Long 151 16 W

Saturday March the 6

this day commences with light breezes from S.W. sundown calm. Misk part the same with Rain later part moderate breezes from S.W. to N. Rain
thus ends the day

Lat 07 30 N Long 150 26 W

Sunday March the 7

this day commences with strong breezes from S.W.W sundown from S.W. one Sail in sight to the S.E. Misk part the same later part from S.W.E
thus ends the day

Lat 6 45 N Long 148 27 W

Monday March the 8

this day commences with fine breezes from S.W. S.W.E one Sail in sight. Misk and later part the same painting West Boat inside
thus ends the day

Lat 6 21 N Long 147 57 W

Tuesday March the 9

this day commences with fine breezes from S.W.E the Mizzen topmast stay parted. Misk and later part fine breezes from S.W. painted the Bow Boat inside
thus ends the day

Lat 4 40 N Long 147 30 W

Wednesday March the 10

this day commences with fine breezes from S.W. parted the Main topmast Brees and Mizzen topmast stay Misk and later part the same painting the Boats overhead thus ends the day

Thursday March the 11

this day commences with strong breezes from S.W. Misk and later part from S.W. took one bag of butter also a new foretop sail to bend
thus ends the day
Lat 00 05 N Long 150 54

Friday March the 12

this day commences with strong trade winds from S.W. to E parted foretop sail for Bending Misk part and later from E rove new Whisk ropes put a new foot rope on the Fore top gallant Sail
thus ends the day
Lat 2 32 N Long 149 56 W

Saturday March the 13

this day commences with strong trade from E Misk part the same at 11 P.M. tacked ship and headed to the Southward to keep clear of Walker Island at A.M. tacked back again to the S.W. later part strong breezes and severe squalls with plenty of Rain split the Main and Mizzen top gallant Sails
thus ends the day
Lat 4 11 N Long 149 08 W

Sunday March the 14

this day commences with strong breezes from S.W. with Rain sundown more moderate. Misk part squally parted the foot rope of the Main sail and split the Sail later part the same with a heavy swell from S.W.
thus ends the day
Lat 14 52 N Long 148 00 W

Monday March the 15

this day commences with moderate breezes and Rain squalls from S.W. Charles Murray and Antonio Barker of duty sick. Misk and later part moderate breezes and Rain from S.W.
Lat 06 00 N Long 148 51 W thus ends the day
