Tuesday March the 16
this day commences with strong breezes from N.E.
with smart squalls and plenty of rain at 6 AM double
reefed the topsails and later part the same
Antony Harker off duty sick with Venereal Chas Haring
off duty sick had a fall from the Fore rigging
repaired up an old foretopmast this ends the day
Lat 07 12 N Long 149 39 W

Wednesday March the 17
this day commences with strong breezes from N.E.
Double reefed topsails repairing Main top galent
sail Mast and later part the same repaired up old
flying jib repairing Main top galent sail
this ends the day
Lat 09 10 N Long 150 23 W

Thursday March the 18
this day commences with strong breezes from N.E.
with Double reefed topsails Mast part the same
later part more moderate all sail out Bent
the Main top galent sail and unbent the Mizzen
top galent sail and reefed it up Making a
Smoke sail this ends the day
Lat 11 11 N Long 150 44 W

Friday March the 19
this day commences with strong breezes from
N.E. and later part the same
Repairing mizen top galent sail and making
a Smoke sail this ends the day
Lat 13 58 N Long 151 04 W

Saturday March the 20
this day commences with strong breezes from
N.E. topsails furled Mast and later
part the same with squalls
this ends the day
Lat 17 48 N Long 152 24 W

Sunday March the 21
this day commences with strong breezes from
N.E. topsails furled Mast part the same
later part the same for Hawihee the wind
from E and cloudy this ends the day
Lat 19 25 N Long 154 14 W

Monday March the 22
this day commences with strong breezes from N.E.
during the day the land at Windward Double reefed
the topsails took in the jib and Main sail and
later part the night no land in sight as yet
at daylight kept on to the W.S.W. at 11 AM saw the
East end of Hawihee bearing S.W. 15 miles Dist
Bent Mizzen top galent sail this ends the day
Lat 19 45 N Long 154 54 W

Tuesday March the 23
this day commences with strong breezes from N.E.
at 4 PM passed the about 6 miles Dist at 8 PM
passed a Schooner the land about 4 miles Dist
during the night by W at 10 AM have too in the passage
between Maui and Hawihee at daylight kept away for
Iwaihau Bay at 10 AM arrived there the Capt went on
shore 3 other ships then the Electra and Barbs Sarah
Sheaff and Warren this ends the day

Wednesday March the 24
this day commences with light breezes from N.W. at 4 PM
received on board 50 bbls of fresh Potatoes and a quarter
of fresh beef at 6 PM the Capt came on board and
left the Bay in company with the other ships for
Honolulu Mast part a Gale from N.E. later part
Moderate and calm Runne in sight bearing from
N.W. E by N four ships in sight also this ends the day
Lat 20 44 N

Thursday March the 25
this day commences with slight breezes from S at 2 PM
the Trader came down with half of a Gale at 4 PM
made calm at Windward Layng off and on Mast part
the same later part a moderate Gale from N.E. at
8 AM the Capt and boats crew went on shore Layng
off and on this ends the day
