Tuesday April the 6

this day commences with light breezes from E at 6 PM
saw fin backs. Mist and later parts fine breezes from
E & E and cloudy saw a ship steering to the N.W. also
fin backs. Repairing foretop sail this ends the day
Lat 23 30 N Long 171 43 W course W by S

Wednesday April the 7
this day commences with fine breezes from E & E and cloudy
braking out for rigging Cordage Mist and later parts light
from E & E to S made three new line covers and calked
their shear body of foreline. this ends the day

Lat 23 46 N Long 171 48 E course W
Changes the day

Friday April the 9
this day commences with light breezes from S at sundown
Calm Mist moderate and Rain from N later strong
from N & E Rain this ends the day
Lat 20 57 N Long 176 24 W course W by S

Saturday April the 10
this day commences with strong breezes from N & E
at sundown a moderate gale from E split the
Mizen Topsail. Mist part the same later part
from S & E with Rain no observations
this ends the day

Supr Lat 24 30 N Long 174 01 W course W

Sunday April the 11
this day with strong breezes and Rain with
severe squalls from S to N.W. Mist and later
parts fine from S.W. Repaired the Mizen
Topsail and fore topmast stay sail
Lat 25 05 N Long 171 04 W this ends the day

Monday April the 12
this day commences with strong breezes and Rain
S.W. to S.W. Mist and later parts light breezes
from W fine weather this ends the day

Tuesday April the 13

this day commences with light gale and calm from
N.W. Mist and later parts light from E to S.W.
Cross new Main Topsails Braces Fore Braces Crossjack
Braces also Fore Main and Mizzen Topsail sometimes
Fore and Main Topsails Reefed
this ends the day
Lat 26 00 N Long 171 13 W course W by N

Wednesday April the 14
this day commences with light breeze from S.W.
at sundown from N.W. Mist and later parts light
at Sund from S & E making new flying jib
out of the Main Tapsal stay sail
this ends the day

Lat 26 17 N Long 168 51 W course W by W

Thursday April the 15
this day commences with fine breezes from E saw
Blackfish lowered the harbour boat struck to
and saved them sundown the breezes from S & E
Mist part strong from S with Rain later part
from W this ends the day
Lat 27 56 N Long 167 58 E

Friday April the 16
this day commences with strong breezes from
W double reefed the Tapsails at 5 PM saw
Blackfish did not lower to rugged at 8 PM split
the jibb. Mist part strong from the W later
part from S.W. sent another jibb and repairing
the other jibb this ends the day
Lat 29 13 N Long 167 26 E

Saturday April the 17
this day commences more moderate breezes from N.W.
at sundown from N.E. Mist and later parts
fine breezes from S.E. to S.W. Boiling Blackfish
saw a ship steering to the N.W. Repairing old
jibb and making a new flying jib
this ends the day
Lat 30 23 N Long 165 41 E course N by W & W
