Friday June the 4th this 1855

day commences with moderate breeze from S.E. and E. Boats down for Whales at 10 AM the West Boat went onto a Whale but did not get fast good lance sundown light breezes from E. Mid part from S.E. later part S and fog no Whales this ends the day
Lat 56 22 N

Saturday June the 5th this day commences with light breezes from all around the compass & ships in sight and scattering ice to the Southward sundown the same foggy at 8 PM saw a Whale did not lower mid part saw light breezes from E lat part calm and haze getting out water this ends the day
Lat 56 23 N Long 140 14 E

Sunday June the 6th this day commences with calm cleared up sundown light from E the main land in sight 60 miles distant bearing from N.W. to W. Mid part from S.E. daylight saw the ice to S.W. later part strong breezes from S.E. saw 3 ships bound to the S.W. this ends the day

Monday June the 7th this day commences with strong breezes from S.E. spoke the Bark Dover and ship Capt Phelps of New London the later 3 ships the season sundown the same thick fog mid and later parts the same saw 3 ships this ends the day

Tuesday June the 8th this day commences with moderate breezes from S.E. to E.S.E. a little more clear ice to Southward sundown the same mid and later part light breezes from S.E. spoke the Bark Congdon of Warren R.I. saw 5 ships ship Wicks on Westward ice to the Southward's northward this ends the day

Wednesday June the 9th this

this day commences with light breezes from S to S.E. sundown S.W. Mid part light from S.W. later part the same saw 3 ships laying off and on the ice no Whales this ends the day
Lat 56 23 N

Thursday June the 10th this day commences with moderate breeze from S.W. sundown the same mid thick fog mid and later parts the same breezes from S.W. this ends the day

Friday June the 11th this day commences with light breeze from S thick fog sundown cleared up mid and later parts light breezes from S.E. ran through some scattering ice no Whales saw 3 ships this ends the day
Lat 56 04 N Long 140 05 E

Saturday June the 12th this day commences with calm coast down the main top sail and top gallant yards and so turned ship into a bark sundown light breezes from E bound S.W. mid part calm later light breezes from S.W. and thick fog this ends the day

Sunday June the 13th this day commences with light breezes and fine weather from S sundown the same stirred down on both of ship mid part calm at 4 PM saw a Whale did not see him again at 10 saw another lowered for him did not see him from the boats going quick to the S.W. later part calm this ends the day
Lat 55 28 N Long 135 4 E Working S

Monday June the 14th this day commences with calm & ships in sight sundown light breezes from E.S.E. mid part the same later part strong breezes from E and thick fog at 10 AM saw scattering ice double respect the top sails and laying too with fore yard aback this ends the day
