

Journal of the Ship Mary Frasier of 1858

Sunday Nov the 21
breezes from S W this day commences with light
with moderate breeze later part to the N W with
rain squalls this ends the day

Lat 13 Long 157 10 W Course S E
Monday Nov the 22
breezes from N at sundown the same with
rainy Mists and later parts fine breezes from E Trade
winds at day light saw a sail to the N E
Washing Ship this ends the day

Lat 14 N Long 156 45 W Course S E
Tuesday Nov the 23
breezes from E at sundown the same with
rainy Mists and later parts fine breezes from
E Trade Winds from
to one Ship in sight this ends the day

Lat 23 42 N Long 156 15 W Course S E by S
Wednesday the 24 Nov
strong Trade Winds from E Mists and later
parts the same Drying Bone
this ends the day

Lat 23 17 N Long 155 51 W
Thursday Nov the 25
Trade Winds from E S E Mists part the
same daylight made the Islands of Mauna
and Molokai at 10 AM tacked off shore
having fetched in to leeward of the passage
some 10 Miles with the wind from E S E
to S E Washing Ship this ends the day

Friday Nov the 26
breezes from E at 2 PM saw the French
Ship Espadon at 7 PM the N E point of Molokai
bearing S W 5 Miles East Mists part Laying off and on
the passage at daylight kept away for Lahaina with
light breezes from E S E the later part light
this ends the day

New Bedford Capt John Round 1858

Saturday Nov the 27
this day commences with light breeze from N E
saw the Shipping in the Harbour at 1 1/2 PM
Capt Round went on shore bent the cables and
got the anchors of the bows at 6 PM Laying off
and on at Lahaina Mists and later part the
same at 11 PM Capt Round came on board
and left for Honolulu this ends the day

Sunday Nov the 28
this day commences with calm
at 6 PM light breeze and cloudy from W
hauled the ship to S E going around to S
of Mauna Kea Mists part a calm a gale and a
heavy rain storm at daylight found ourselves
between Kaimo and Kona at 9 AM trades winds
from E and so ends the day

Monday Nov the 29
this day commences with light
breeze from E at 2 PM strong breeze from
E N E at 5 PM made the E end of Oahu bearing
N W Molokai bearing from N to N E passed one
Ship Mists part strong breezes from E N E Laying
off and on at 9 AM received a Pilot at 11 AM
Anchored in Honolulu Towed in with Steam
so ends the day and breeze
