 Tuesday Nov the 30th port of Honolulu

This day Drying Bone
 Wednesday Oct the 1st Drying Thursday the 2nd
 & three men missing Natives went on shore last night and have not returned as yet getting but sticks a heavy rain storm Friday the 3rd Drying and Bundling Bone and setting up hooks Saturday the 4th this day hauled along side of the Mountain Wave of Boston Capt Hardy and delivered on board of said ship 65 Bundles of Bone in first order the aggregate weight of wreck was 8271 lbs eight thousand seven hundred seventy one pounds marked ME with white paint also one bundle of damaged Bone 67 pounds marked the same Sunday the 5th all hands on shore on Liberty Monday the 6th this day commenced to discharge Oil on board of the ship Mountain Wave Tuesday the 7th Discharging Oil Wednesday the 8th Discharging Oil Thursday the 9th at daylight I went forward to call all hands as usual when 8 Portuguese refused to work their complaint was that they would not work any more for the 200th day the consequence was that they were taken on shore and placed in the jail and six Natives employed in their place their names was Chas Fuller Coleb Sears Chas Stewart Jos Spawford Chas Harry and Antone Baker Discharging Oil Friday the 10th Discharging Oil Saturday the 11th Discharging Oil Sunday the 12th Discharging Oil Monday the 13th Discharge the 3rd Coffers for Camery Liberty Monday the 14th Discharging Oil Tuesday the 15th Rain all day doing Nothing Wednesday the 16th Discharging Oil Thursday the 17th got through Discharging Oil the six men on board to their duty from the list of gages of the oil delivered on board of the ship Mountain Wave of Boston Capt Hardy What Oil in short Casks No from 1 to 208 marked ME
