Tuesday April the 19

This day commences with strong breezes from ESE & Sea to the N. Mist and later parts strong from NE spoke the Ship Adeline Gibbs of Fairhaven and gammed with her this ends the day

Wednesday April the 20

This day commences with strong breezes from NE at 6 PM the Capt came on board with and later part light breeze from NE this ends the day

Lat 51 33 N Long 151 35 E

Thursday April the 21

This day commences with light breezes from NE and later parts light breezes from ESE this ends the day

Lat 52 17 N Long 151 45 E Course NE by N

Friday April the 22

This day commences with light breezes from ESE and later part the same working to the NE through scattering Sea this ends the day

Lat 53 10 N Long 152 00 E

Saturday April 23

This day commences with light breezes from ESE at 4 PM we saw ship to NE at 7 PM light snow storm and scattering Sea for Hamaku Boat Harbor of Dutch with General or Dyke

At by water name in Keak mid part calm and light snow storm later part light breezes from E to N working to the NE through scattering Sea this ends the day

Sunday April the 24

This day commences with light breezes from NE at 6 PM we saw a bark to the S.W. mid part moderate later part strong breeze from NE working to the NE through scattering Sea two ships in sight this ends the day

Monday April the 25

This day commences with strong breezes from NW at 6 PM heavy Sea to the N. mid part heading to the West later part strong from WSW with snow squalls one ship in sight this ends the day

Tuesday April the 26

This day commences with moderate breezes from NW Sea to the NE mid and later parts fine breeze from NW saw 5 ships working to the N through scattering Sea this ends the day

Lat 54 44 N Long 154 06 E

Wednesday April the 27

This day commences with fine breezes from N. part the Ship Maria Theresa and Circumator saw one ship in the Sea at sundown scattering Sea all around us mid and later parts moderate breezes from NW fields of Sea and large spots of clear water 5 ships in sight this ends the day

Lat 55 25 N Long 154 34 E

Thursday April the 28

This day commences with light breezes from NW at 6 PM moderate breezes from NE mid and later parts light from NE to NW made the Land bearing 8 ships in sight to N this ends the day

Friday April the 29

This day commences with light breezes from NW at 5 PM spoke the Ship Maria Theresa mid part fog and snow squalls from N. later part a moderate gale from NE with scattering Sea this ends the day

Lat 55 44 N Long

Saturday April the 30

This day commences with strong breezes from NE mid part moderate later part light from NW to NNE 8 ships in sight and scattering Sea Lat 55 22 this ends the day
