

Journal of Ship Mary Teazer of 1859

Sunday May the 1

This day commences with light breeze from N.W. at 2 P.M. spoke the Ship Baseline Gibbs, Mad and later parts light from N.W. to N.E. 6 ships in sight and all scattering See S.P. samples of Dutz, seals with Dutzogs thus ends the day

Monday May the 2

This day commences with light breeze from N. Mad and later parts light from N.E. to N. at 8 A.M. saw the land bearing about 80 miles East heavy See to the N

thus ends the day

Tuesday May the 3

This day commences with strong breezes from N. bent the Old Foremast and fire killed two Dogs mad and later parts light breezes N. Working Westward thus ends the day

Lat 55 18 N Long 153 39 E

Wednesday May the 4

This day commences with light breezes from N. Scattering fields of See Mad and later part moderate breeze from N.W. to W. the See tending N. and N. Working Southward

Lat 54 16 N thus ends the day

Thursday May the 5

This day commences with moderate breezes from N.W. a large body of heavy See to the Westward rather a dull look around here just now Mad and later parts light breeze from S.W. to W. at noon fell in with heavy See to the Eastward

thus ends the day

Friday May the 6

This day commences with light breeze from W. heavy See to the E. tending N. and N. Working to the N. Mad and later parts strong breezes and cloudy from S.E. scattering See thus ends the day

Saturday May the 7

This day commences with strong breezes from S.E. at 4 P.M. came on a thick snow storm Mad and later parts strong breezes and thick fog from S to N.W. thus ends the day

Sunday May the 8

This day commences with strong breeze from S.W. cleared off saw the ship St. George at 2 P.M. spoke her Mad part light from S.E. later part got one boat load of Wood from ship St. George and gave her three bbls of Potatoes strong breeze from N.E. at noon came on thick snow storm

thus ends the day

Monday May the 9

This day commences with strong breezes and severe snow storm at 4 P.M. saw See to the N.W. wire ship and went still to the E. S. E. Mad and later part a moderate gale and snow storm from S.E.

thus ends the day

Lat 54 48 N Long 154 47 E

Tuesday May the 10

This day commences with moderate gale from S.E. Mad part moderated later part light breeze from N.W. and clear weather scattering See to the Westward thus ends the day

Lat 54 46 N Long 154 18 E

Wednesday May the 11

This day commences with light breezes from N.W. to W. Mad and later parts light breeze from S.W. to S. brook out water

thus ends the day

Thursday May the 12

This day commences with light breezes from S. at 5 P.M. spoke the ship Spartan of Nantux Cabre Mad part light from W. later part the same

thus ends the day
