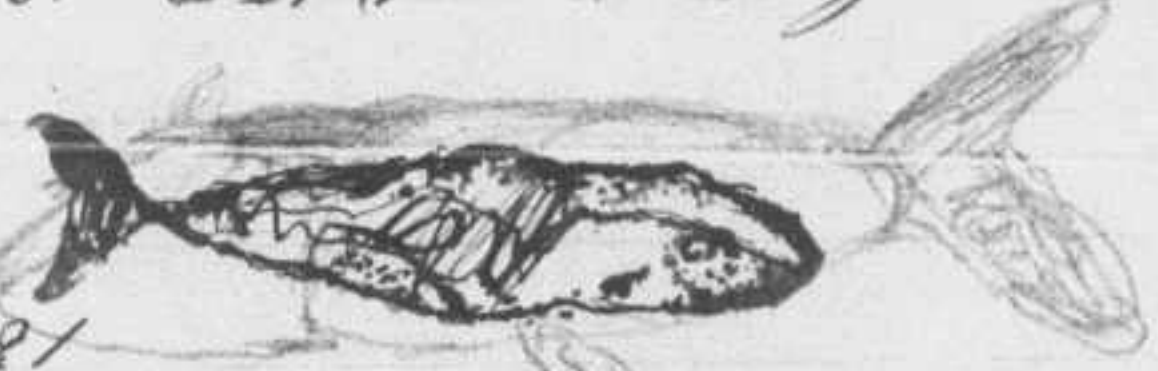


Monday April the 18
