with all sail set Watch employed in breaking
out Flour beams bread Ship off Ice Cape Lat 70-24

Wednesday August the 11

Comms With a Light breeze from the S.
Ship steering N.W. Middle part Luff to the
Wind with the fore yard back latter part
Gave with the Wailua and At 9 A.M. lowered
for Whales Did not see him a Fair Ship
bound to the S and W Watch employed in
Ship Duty Lat 70-28

Saturday August the 14

Comms With a Light breeze from the S.
Ship heading N.W. a Gave with the
Wailua and At four p.m. it Commence to
show fresh and we Dabble reef the fore topsail
and single reef the Main topsail and the
Wailua boat want a board latter part
Winds haul to the N.W. turn the reef out
of the topsail and set the Main topsail

Sunday August the 15

Comms With a breeze from the N and W
Ship steering S.W. in Company with the Wailua
At 10 p.m. fell in with a large body of Ice
and kept of S.E. latter part haul up to the
S.W. Watch employed in Ship Duty Lat 69-51
