Friday August the 24

Comms With a Light breeze from the E
Ship steering N.W. With All sail set At 4 p.m.
bent a new foresail and maintopsail and spanker
At 6 p.m. Winds haul to the N. and Comms to
blow and at half past 7 Dull reef the topsail
and furl the jib and mainsail Ship lying
With the head yards aback All night

Latter part Winds haul to the N.W.
Ship tack At 5 A.M. and took in the foresail and
fore topsail & Cloas reef the maintopsail Lat 68-25

Saturday August the 25 Long 174-23

Comms With a strong breeze from the N.W.
Ship heading N.W. lying to under a Cloas reef
maintopsail and fore and mainsails and spanker.
Latter part more moderate With plenty of rain
set the fore topsail Watch employed in getting
out water Lat 69-10

Sunday August the 26 Long 174-28

Comms With a strong breeze from the N.W.
Ship heading W.S.W. With Cloas reef topsails and
staysails and plenty of rain Latter part more
moderate but plenty of snow turn one reef
out of the topsails Watch employed in Long 172-06
Ship Duty Lat 68-38

Monday August the 27

Comms With a strong breeze from the N.W.
Ship heading W.S.W. With plenty of snow and rain
At one p.m. set the foresail and jib and turn
the reef out the topsails and At 4 p.m. tack
Ship heading N.W. Latter part calm hands
employed in breaking out bread beams. Snow
Lat 68-15 Long 172-48

August the 28 1858

Saturday the 28

Comms With a Light breeze from the N.W.
Ship heading N.W. With All sail set
and plenty of snow hands employed in stowing
the sail, pen and bending new Tars on the
yards Latter part Winds haul to the N.W.
Ship heading N.W. With All sail set
fine clear weather

Lat 68-03

Sunday the 29 Long 173-28

Comms With a light breeze from the N.W.
Ship steering N.W. With All sail set Watch
employed in bending a new fore topsail Latter part
took in the light sail and single reef the fore
topsail saw a land head two miles Wind haul to the
N.W. Ship heading W.S.W. Lat 68-35

Monday August the 30 176-18

Comms With a strong breeze from the N.W.
Ship heading N.W. With squally weather
At 6 p.m. saw two spouts and At 4 p.m. Dull
reef the topsails and furl the jib and mainsail
and set the boats on the upper cranes Latter part
took in the foresail. Cloas reef the fore topsail
Watch employed in getting out water

Lat 68-31

Tuesday August the 31 Long 173-50

Comms With a strong breeze from the N.W.
Ship under Dull reef topsail heading N.W.
At 2 p.m. Rept of E by S and turn the reef out of the
topsails and set the jib & mainsail Latter part
set the maintagsail and royal and Rept her
E.S.E.
