Tuesday July the 5 Long 175-22 E
Comms With a light breeze from the S.E.
Ship heading E Saw plenty of ice to the west
At 3 p.m. named With the Lewis 4 sails in
sight Latter part foggy bent a new fore
topsail and rip the old one up

Wednesday July the 6

Comms With a light breeze from the S.E.
Ship heading S.W. With thick foggy weather
Hands employed in mending the Main top-sail
and bending it Latter part
fine clear weather winds from the S.E.
Ship heading East 3 sails in sight

Thursday July the 7 1859

Comms With a light breeze from the S.E.
Ship heading E With all sail set two ships
in sight hands employed in bending a new
Main top-sail Ship off Cape shadows latter
part calm and clear weather hands
employed in getting out water

Friday July the 8

Comms With a strong breeze from the S.E.
Ship heading E With all sail set
one ship in sight At 6 p.m. a boat
came aboard from the Lewis a Landing
Saw a number of humphs back
Latter part fine clear weather hands
employed in ship duty Lat

Saturday July the 9 W.W.
Comms With a light breeze from the
Ship heading N.W. in to the land
Saw 12 sails in sight all bound
to the N and E Latter part thick
foggy weather Watch employed in
ship duty off Plover bay

Sunday July the 10

Comms With a light breeze from the W.W.
Ship heading N.W. Working round the land
With thick fog Latter part the same
