Thursday July the 19

Comms With a light breeze from the S.E.
Ship steering N.E. by E with all sail set
With cloudy weather and rain
Saw one brig and 3 ships at Lawrence Island
With in sight latter part made

Steele Island and then Cloas to it
then kept off to for the Western
Shore again

Friday July the 20

Comms With a strong breeze from the S.E.
Ship steering N with all sail set
Middle part double reef the topsail
latter part thick fog at 7 A.M.
turn the reefs out watch employed
in breaking out snow

Thursday July the 21

Comms With a strong breeze from the
S.E. Ship heading S.W. with
thick fog at 1 P.M. double reef
the topsail and rounded in E &
latter part light winds with
rain at 10 P.M. turn the reefs
out of the topsail

Comms With a light breeze from the
S.E. Ship heading S.E. with thick
fog with little rain latter part
calms watch employed in breaking
out beef and pork & cheese

Comms With Calms and thick
fog at 2 P.M. it lit up lower
down the Starboard boat for Calapago
Grays and band one come in thick
again boat came a board latter part
it clear off saw 5 sails in sight at 9
A.M. came in thick again saw plenty of
riflers

Sunday July the 24

Comms With a light breeze from the
S.E. Ship heading S.W. with thick
rain weather at 6 P.M. it clear of a
little and kept off West for Lawrence
bay latter part the same at 9 P.M.
came with the Robert Edwards
Ship steering N

Monday July the 25

Comms With a light breeze from the S.E.
Ship heading N.E. a hazy aback with
thick fog weather latter part
the same at 6 P.M. kept off
West gain

Comms With a light breeze from the S.W.
Ship steering N with thick rain
weather at 4 P.M. luff to the wind
with the head yards aback rounded
got 17 fathom then brize forward
latter part the same
