Wednesday July the 27

Come with a strong breeze from the north
Ship heading N E at 2 p.m. set the
flying jib and main topgallant sail saw one
brig and a ship going to anchor off
South Head at 10 p.m. came to anchor
in St. Lawrence bay latter part. saw as
employed in getting off water.

Thursday July the 28

Come with a strong breeze from the north
Ship still going to anchor a getting off
water in company with the Lewis and
Christ Mitchell and the brig Antilla
at 11 p.m. got the last raft off and it
came in thick rain weather latter
part the same with plenty of rain

Friday July the 29

Come with a strong breeze from the north
Ship still going to anchor with the
Lewis and Christ Mitchell and brig Antilla
latter part rain at 6 p.m. got under
way ship heading N E & E ship in sight

Saturday July the 30

Come with a light breeze from the north
Ship heading N E & E ship in sight
latter part wind haul to the north
Ship heading N E with all sail
set with cloudy weather

Monday July the 31

Come with a strong breeze from the north
Ship heading N E at 2 p.m. took in
the light sails and suble reef the topsail
and jib and mainsail furled them at 3 p.m.
took ship heading in shore off Cape
East latter part took in the fore and main topsail



Tuesday August the 1

Come with a strong breeze from the north
Ship heading W N W under a close reef
main topsail and reef fore sail off Cape East
at 3 p.m. set the fore and main topsail
and at 7 p.m. threw the reef out
latter part wind haul to the north
Ship heading N W at 7 p.m. pick up
a Calappaia Gray and cut him in
foggy weather

Wednesday August the 2

Come with a light breeze from the north
Ship heading N E with all sail set
at working up in the light saw 3 sail in
sight at 4 p.m. stood close in to Cape
East and took middle part cloudy
weather with some fog latter part
strong breeze took in the light sail
saw the Christ Mitchell on our starboard
beam
