

Ship off Cape Liddorne 1859

Wednesday Aug the 17
Commenced with a light breeze from the S E
Ship steering S E with all sail set
in Company with the Polar Star at 3
p.m. the Olga Addams and Sam
with him later part fog at 10 p.m.
Saw with the Wm C Mize

Thursday the 18
Commenced with a light breeze from the S E
Ship heading N W sailing with the
Wm C Mize and Polar Star at 2 p.m. saw
a whale lowered for him five sails in
sight latter part saw 15 sails in sight
and 2 with three boats down strong breeze from
the S Ship heading W S W took in the light
sails Lat 69-10

Friday the 19
Commenced with a strong breeze from the S
Ship heading W S W at 6 p.m. Dable reef the
top sail Polar Star and Wm C Mize on our
Quarter latter part turn the reefs out of
the top sail and set the top and courses
Polar Star on our Weather beam
at 6 p.m. haul up the courses thick fog
at 11 p.m. Dable reef the fore
top sail Wind haul to the S E
Ship heading E hand employed in
breaking out provision

Saturday Aug the 20
Commenced with a strong breeze from the S E
Ship heading E hand Dable reef top sails
and reef fore sail with thick fog latter
part fine clear weather made all
sail ship standing in the lead in the
Cape Liddorne one ship in sight

Sunday the 21
Commenced with a light breeze from the S E
Ship steering N E with all sail set
& ship in sight 2 with three boats
down latter part saw 20 sails in sight
and two a boiling at 5 p.m. lowered for a
whale and saw a number of ships whaling

Lat 69-18

Monday Aug the 22
Commenced with a light breeze from the N
Ship heading N W saw 23 sails in sight
5 gave a boiling and a number whaling
at 3 p.m. saw whales and lowered for them
saw some weather ice to the N latter part
wind haul to the N E at 4 p.m. saw
a number of whales and lowered for them
and saw a bark cutting at 8 p.m. set in
thick fog ship lying with the
head yards back
