had five Kanaka Tump seen but we lost
one land 8 miles off

Monday April the 9 1860
Commenced With a strong Gale from the S.W. and E
At 10 p.m. Winds haul to the S.W. and at
11 p.m. Ship a Sea above the bulworks and
and Carried a Way the three Lar but houts
and started the fast rope off the main
topsail latter part the same

Wednesday April the 11 Long 168 E.
Commenced With a Gale from the S.E. Ship
Lying to under a close reef main topsail At
half past two Ship Sea on the Starboard bow
Stone in the Galley and broke the Stone all
to pieces and Carried a Way the fore Scuttle
and some of the bulworks Middle part
blow away the fore topmast Staysail latter part
moderate hands employed in cooking meat in
the Tryworks and making a Galley and fore
Scuttle

Thursday May 4 10 Long 169 E.
Commenced With a light breeze from the N.E.
Ship heading N.W. With all sail set
At 6 A.M. Made the Ice 1860

Only the 2 from the title
Winds from the S.W. & E All Lat 58-31
of July With thick rain Long 171-39
Weather

off Plover Bay 1860

Sunday May the 20
Commenced With a light breeze from the N.E.
Ship heading N.W. With all sail set At
one p.m. Made the main body of ice and
tack Ship and At 5 p.m. Sailed With
the Eliza Adams had nothing but saw one
Whale

Thursday June the 26 Lat 60-47 N
Long 174-23 E
Commenced With a strong breeze from the N.E.
Ship heading N.W. in between Markies and
Plover Bay a Gamen With the Ship had
five sails in flight and the bays full of
Ice

Wednesday June the 27
Commenced With a strong breeze from the N.E.
Ship heading N.W. in to Markies Bay At 10
A.M. Came to anchor in 16 fathom of
Water in company With the omega and
America

Sunday July the 1
Commenced With a light Gale from the S.W.
Ship heading W.N.W. under a close reef
fore topsail and double reef main topsail
and single reef Mizzen and fore bark in
Maiden Spencer set a trying to work to
the Windward At 7 p.m. Saw one bow
head Only the 2, 3, 4, 5. Thick rain weather
on the fourth Came to anchor in 20
fathom of Water. Only the 6 strong breeze
from the N.E. Ship off Indian point arriving
Down for Phoenix Bay At 7 p.m. off
the bay saw one bow head
