Remarks on board Thursday 17

this day strong breeze and squalls from S.W. making new log house and vice bench & at 7 PM shortened sail latter part strong and squalls and some rain squalls filling boats

Lat 36.30 Long 62.30

Remarks on board Friday 18

this day strong breeze and squalls at 3 shortened sail latter part light and rain squalls from the west at 11 AM picked up a barrel of Petroleum oil the barrel was worked eaten started in to keep barrel

Lat 37.25 Long 63.23

Remarks on board Saturday 19

this day light wind and fair weather at 4 PM shortened sail at 5 PM saw some squalls latter part strong breeze at 10 AM commenced raining wind from N.W.

Remarks on board Sunday 20

this day strong breeze and plenty of rain at 11 AM lifted up and stop raining at 9 shortened sail latter part light wind and rain squalls all day

Lat 38.25 Long 63.25

Remarks on board Monday

this day light wind and rain squalls all day got 4 staves ripe latter part light wind and rain squalls from N.W.

Lat 38.44 Long 63.27

Remarks on board Tuesday

this day light and rain squalls from N.W. at 10 AM shorted all sail but at 11 AM a hard squall of wind and rain beat off before the wind to make us sail the sail in left to wind latter part light and rain squalls and bad weather

Remarks on board Wednesday 23

this day strong breeze and plenty of rain in squalls wind from N.W. to N.N.W. at 4 AM double reefed sail at 6 AM double reefed 2nd sail and reefed 3rd sail took in 1st sail and hauled down head stanchion latter part fresh gale from S.W. and rain squalls at 2 PM saw a squall took 2nd sail 2nd sail double reefed 3rd sail heading N.W. at 7 AM hard squall of wind and rain parted all 3rd sail sheet took in main 2nd sail and fixed it at 8 AM wore ship heading south took in at 5 AM star sail sent down to 2nd yard hoisted up the boat on the upper canvas took out the awl and part of the craft and put on extra gaskets

at 10 AM 2nd sail double reefed at 11 AM hard squall and the gear wind

Remarks on board Thursday 24

this day fresh gale and rain squalls from N.W. at 12 PM and at 3 PM hauled squalls of wind and rain at 4 PM double reefed all 3rd sail over a gin and gear ring at 4 PM latter part strong breeze and squalls and rain squalls wind from N to N.E. made sail cover N.W. South fitted 2nd sail yard

Remarks on board Friday 25

this day strong breeze and squalls from N.W. to N.E. all sail set course N.W. and pass Dutch ship band Eastward fitting 2nd 3rd yard at 4 PM the quarter block strap parted of 1st sail yard and filled the strap latter part strong breeze and rain squalls from course

Lat 39.14 Long 64.33

Remarks on board Saturday 26

this day light wind and squalls from N.W. to N.E. course shifted to South saw nothing sent up 2nd 3rd yards and sundry on the job latter part light wind from N.E. to East all sail set, put six muzzingil gins
