wind from West cleared up set 1/2 sail and
1/2 sail at 4 pm took 1/2 sail latter part
light wind cloudy made all sail at 10 am
calm nothing in site Lat 40.20
Long 25.20

Remarks on board Mon 27
this day commence with a calm 1 pm
light wind from W at 3 pm strong
breeze took in light at 5 pm fresh gail
at 7 strong gail and rain squalls
clearest reef all 1/2 sail and Mizen stay sail
latter part strong breeze set back out
1/2 sail gill and Main at 9 am took in
gill and 1/2 sail at 10 1/2 sail and 1/2 sail
clearest reef M 1/2 sail Lat 40.50
Long 28.04

Remarks on board Thursday 28
this day strong gail and fair weather
from NW clearest reef M 1/2 sail
latter part strong breeze from NW set
double reef sail gill 1/2 sail
Lat 40.17
Long 24.25

Remarks on board Fri 29
this day light wind and fair weather from
NW at 10 am all sail set nothing in site all sail
set standing back and back, bound to distant
this morning in making sail the mate
Silvai was lipper to the mate, the
mate hit him on the head and he shot
up his gill latter part light wind and
cloudy all sail set sent down 1/2 sail
and repairs it Lat 40.20 Long 25.41
