Remarks on board Monday 11
this day light cloudy at 1st open ship
and at 2nd the sail at 2 commencing raining
thunder and lightning 4 men came on board
to see the boat Latter Part strong breeze
from North fair weather about sail to
the Bay George and Ben came on board
this morning it rain so hard they did
not get in time to come on board just
night watch on liberty

Remarks on board Tuesday 12
this day strong breeze from North and
fair weather put sail at 6 watch well
returned, heard nothing from those 6
men it run away on the 8th Latter Part
light and some rain and some fair weather
watch on liberty fitted yard while
block to Latter Part

Remarks on board Wednesday 13
this day light air and variable 6 men watch
returned of but Frank Boat steers
John Latter Part light from South
fair weather Frank and John watch
on liberty, take the wind's gear to
peace and clean it and put it together
a gin

Remarks on board Thursday 14
this day fresh gale from the South
at 4 P.M. let go starboard at 5 P.M.
at the boat went after the watch got
3 men Latter Part light wind and fair
weather from S to NW 6 P.M. rest of watch
returned the other watch on liberty
take the starboard anchor

Remarks on board Friday 15
this day light air black the bars on
the 1st George at watch returns all but
the 6th and Jim George
Latter Part light wind rain squall &
at 1 P.M. John
run a way suppose they went in a
boat from shore coop Jim returned

At Anchor St Catharine Brazil
Remarks on board Monday 16
this day light and variable wind and rain
squall heard nothing from the men
that run a way Latter Part fine weather
black Bens on starboard side capt went
shore to up to the city

Remarks on board Tuesday 17
this day fine weather at 1 P.M. capt started
for City in a shore boat Latter Part
light air and calm got of three barrels
of sand sent 4 cash on for water Frank
boat tied the mate slap him and
sent him below and hit him with a piece
of rope be fore he would go he saw

he has bin a growler and grumblin
for some time he he the sail boat steer
broke his liberty the 14th that he healf
John and Jim them to get
away from the ship at 4 P.M. the capt
returned from city Latter Part calm and
light wind the South loose the sail to
go

Remarks on board Wednesday 18
this day strong breeze from the South
fired the sail Bark Briton of New Bedford
capt cornell 220 of so this season
Bark Spray left for westward ground
Latter Part light wind and fair weather
Ship ready for sea

this day light and fine weather from East and
Latter Part the same

this day strong breeze from North
