Remarks on board Sat 21

this day light wind and fair weather from North all hand on board except run a way latter part strong breeze from North got off 4 castles and stowed the water down tarred the gill gzes &

Remarks on board Sunday 22

this day light wind and fine weather from North latter part calm all hand on board heard nothing from the run a way

Remarks on board Mon 23

this day light wind and fair weather from North at 4 Pm strong breeze from South latter part the same

Remarks on board Tues 24

this day light wind and variable and rain squall at 6 strong breeze W M latter part fine weather waiting for men we sold up to Peoppe on shoas 10 gallons of Black Fish oil

Remarks on board Wed 25

this day strong breeze and rain squall from South latter part fine weather ship waiting for men

Remarks on board Thud 26

this day fine weather latter part fine weather loose the sail to day

At Anchor St Catharine Brazil

Remarks on board Friday 28

this day light wind and fine weather from North at 8 strong breeze from the South first the sail waiting for men latter part fair weather

Remarks on board Saturday 28

this day fine weather latter part fine weather

Remarks on board Sunday 29

this day fine weather &c latter part the same

Remarks on board Monday 30th

this day fine weather from West W M at 2 Pm saw that some of the men that they had been drinking rum & spirits were very quiet at 4 Pm they got into quarrell and ended in fight James Davis got stab three times with a Jack Knife by Perry Kip a Portuguese capt and officers heard the cry, the third mate

had the sack on back he was or trying to stop the row when the rest got on back, first the cuts of Davis and put Perry Kip in the rigem and wrap him there latter part fine weather at 6 Am take him out of the rigem and put him in ions and put him below at 6 Am capt Gunning of ship Alfred Gibbs and capt cotton of Bark John Davidson and they thought that the cut was not dangerous
